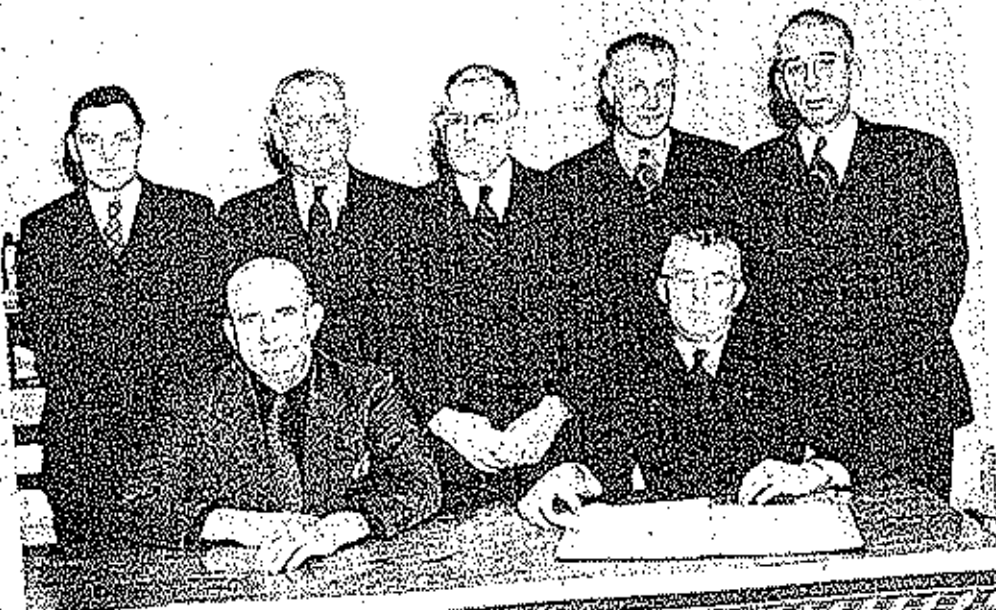

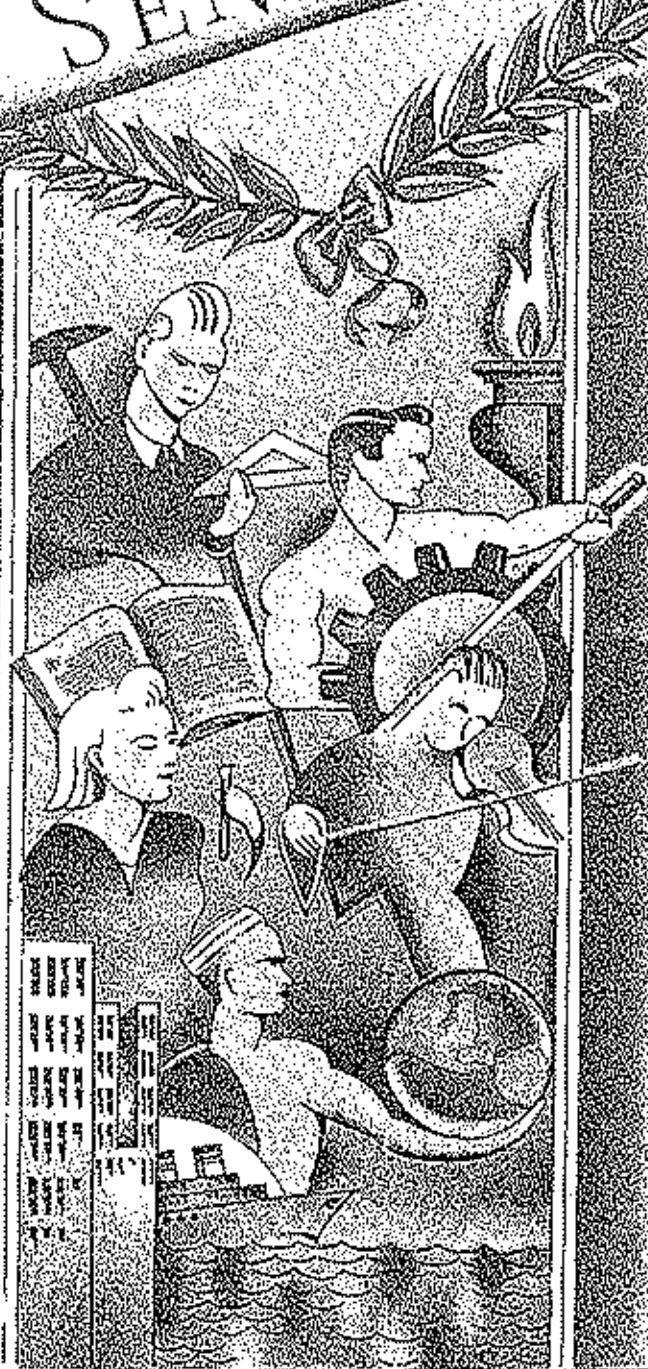

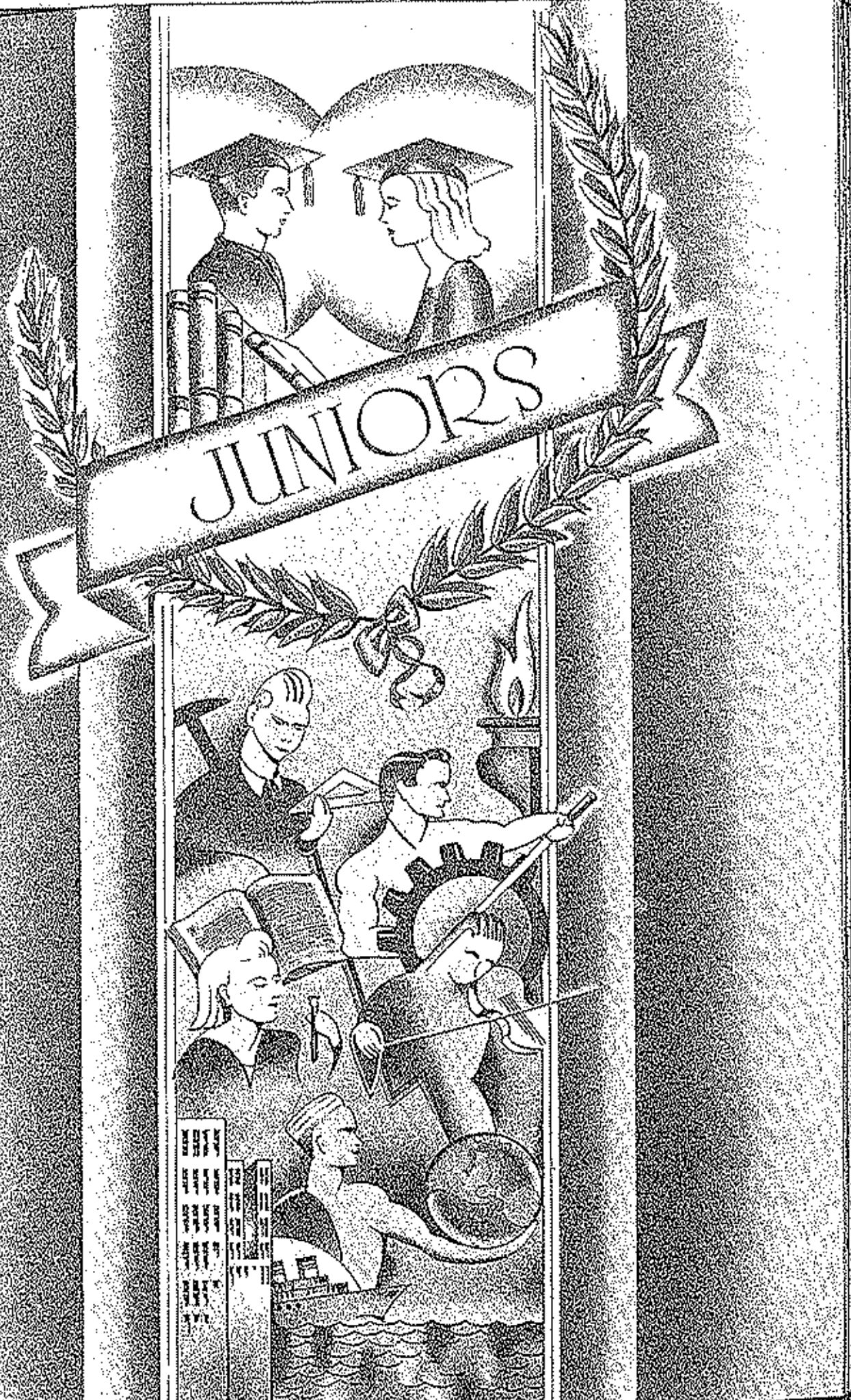
And then--O joyful day! The proud trek across the stage to receive our diplomas.

JUNIOR CLASS HISTORY

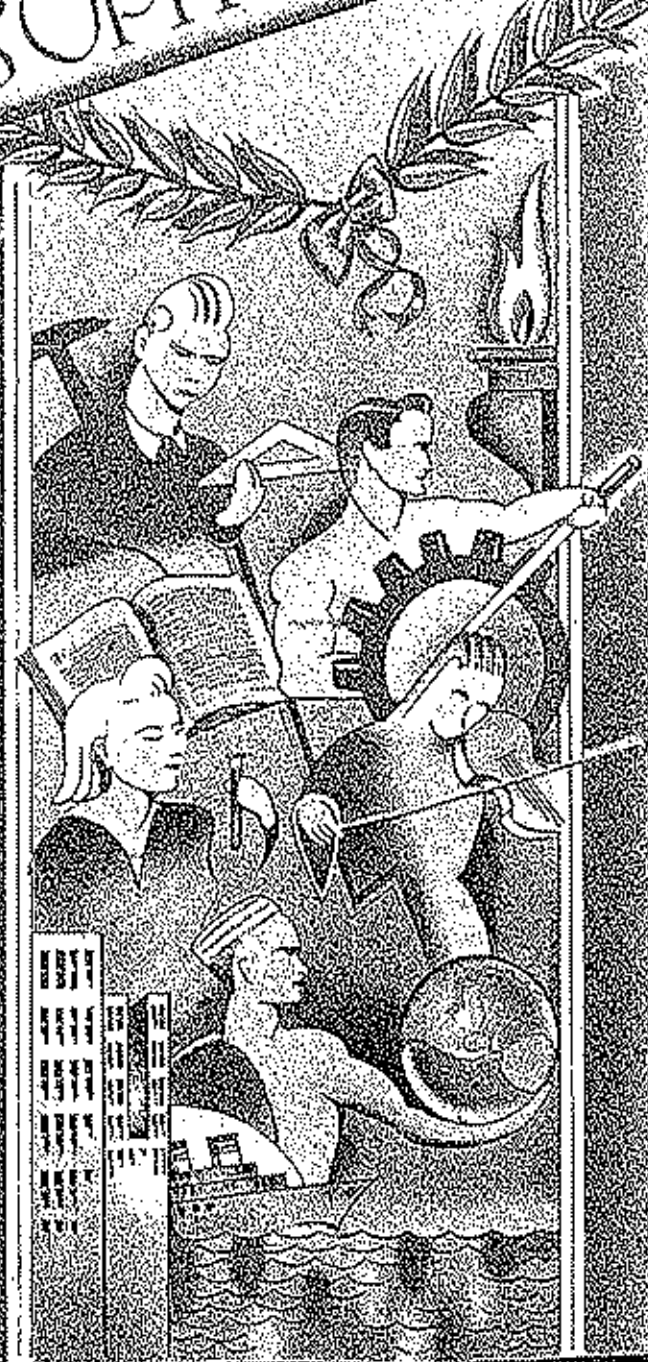
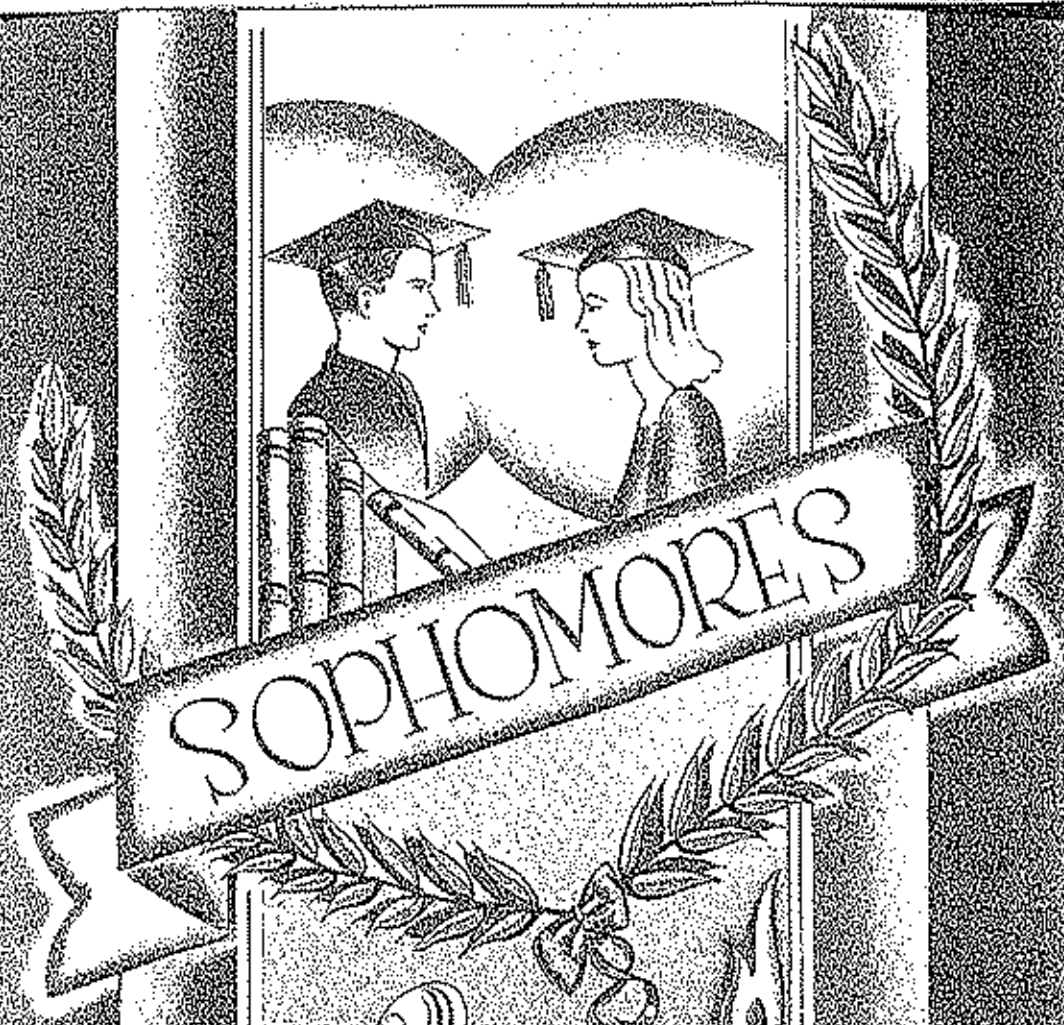

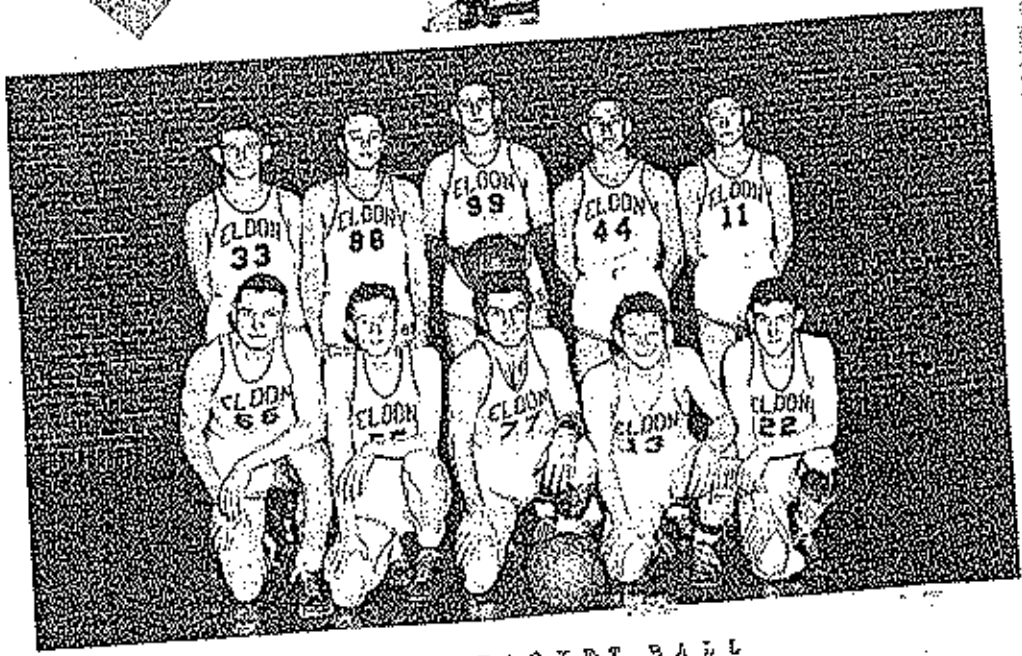


History of the Freshmen Class 1946-47

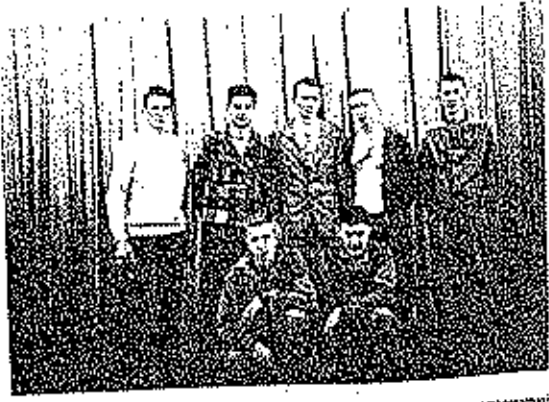

THE ATHLETIC PROGRAM

Following the softball tournament, basketball practice began with approximately fifty boys out for the team. Within two weeks this number was cut to twenty boys then on the "A" team and ten on the "B" team. These teams had only a month of practice before the first game with Dixon High School.

The "A" team, captained by John Vernon, played eighteen regularly scheduled games plus five tournaments in which 18 games were played, making a total of 36 games.

In tournament play, the Mustangs took second in the Stover Tournament, third in the Clinton Tournament and third in the Eldon Tournament. In scheduled games the team won 13-5, taking second in the Tri-County Conference with 7 wins and 3 losses. On the home floor the Mustangs were rough on the opposition winning eleven of thirteen played. The total record at this date is 24 wins and 13 losses with the state playoffs in the near future.
