After returning home Johnny will attend school, six days a week, till September when their summer vacation begins.



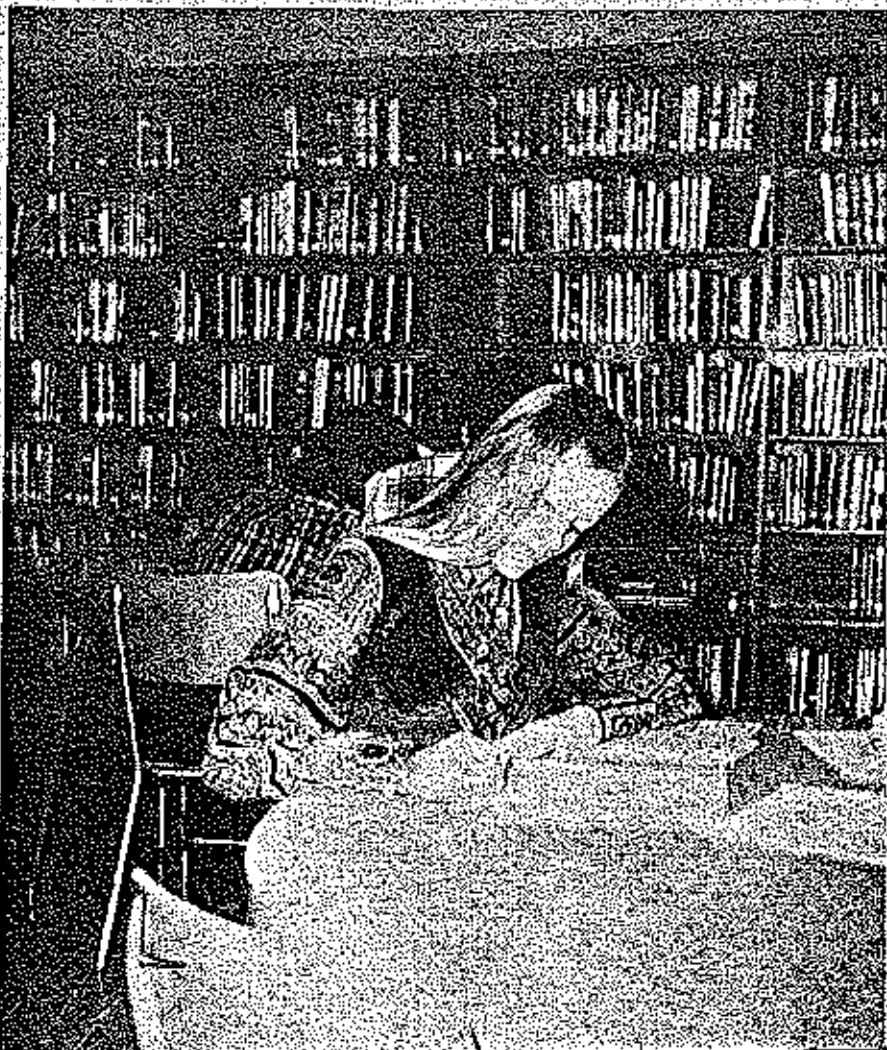
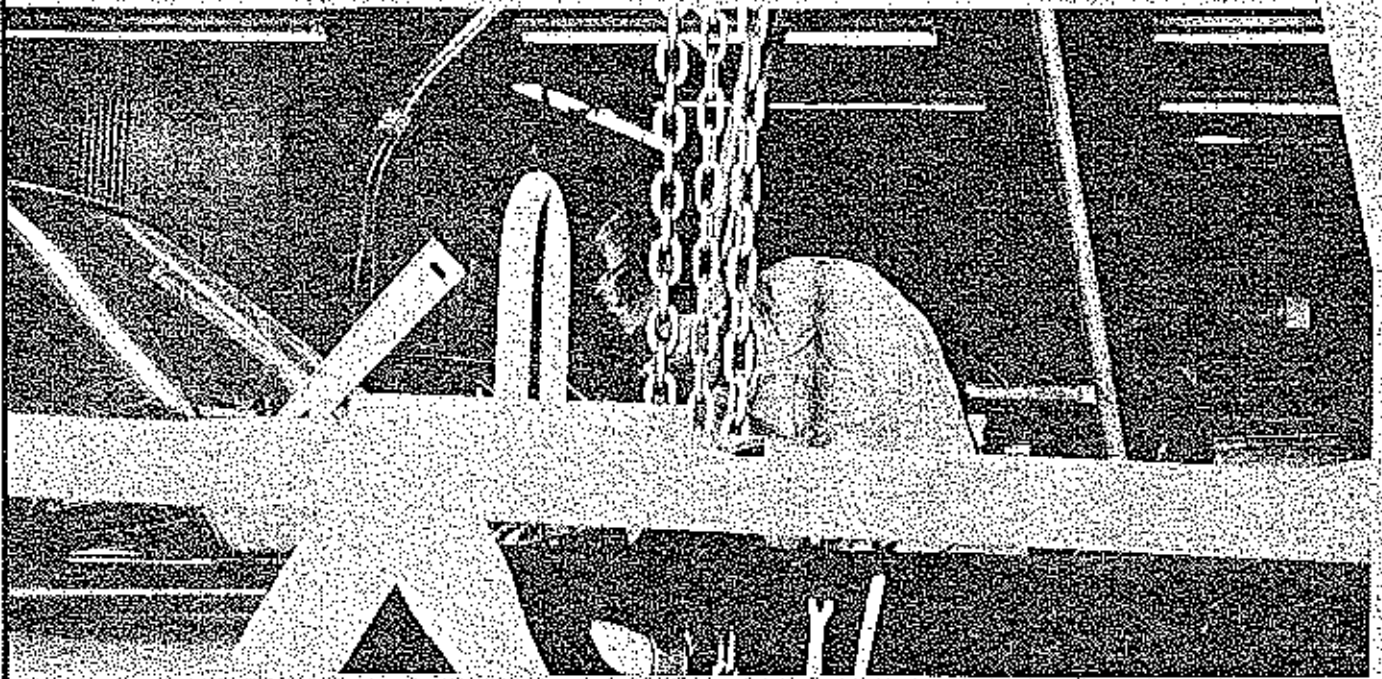

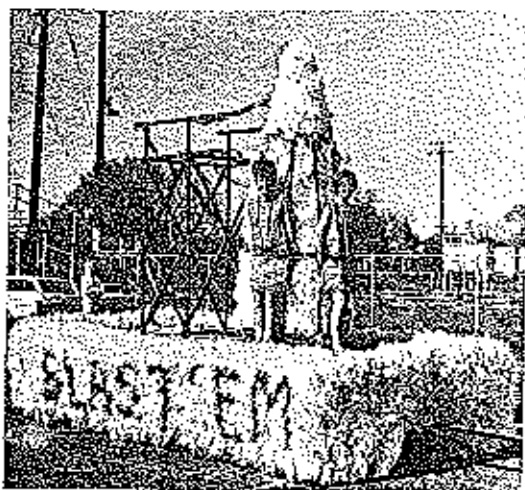
homecoming activities

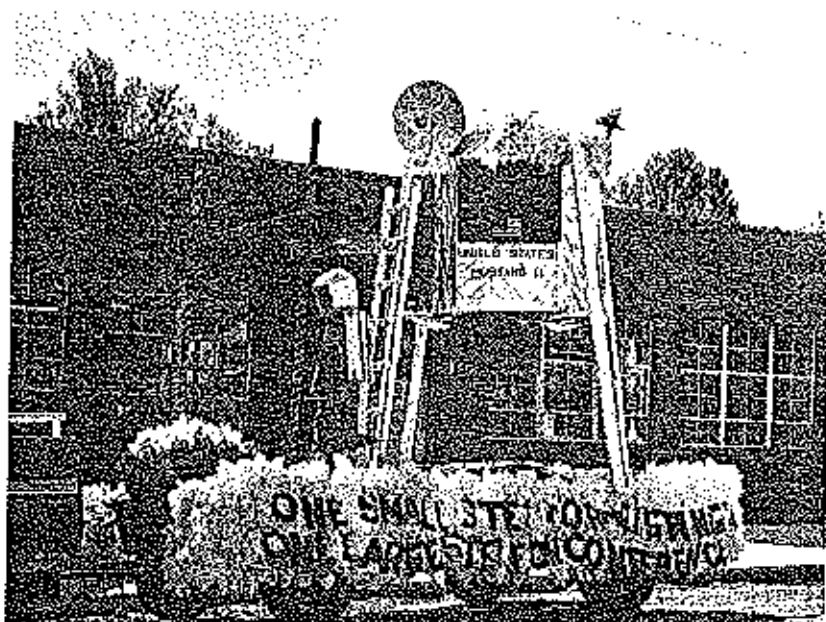

christmas assembly

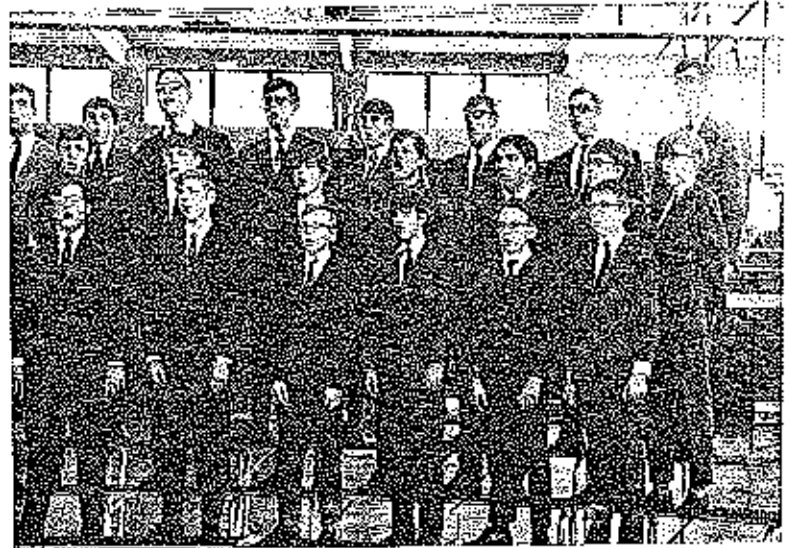
The E.H.S. music, dramatics, and speech departments joined efforts to present the annual Christmas assembly. It was one of our most outstanding.

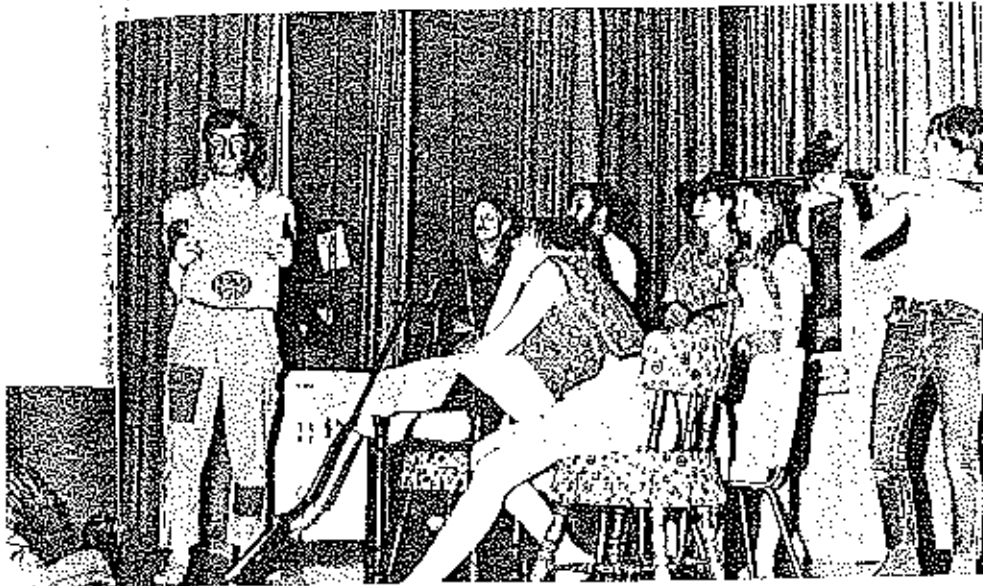

"Impromptu" was selected to represent E.H.S. as this year's contest play. The cast brought home a "1" rating.

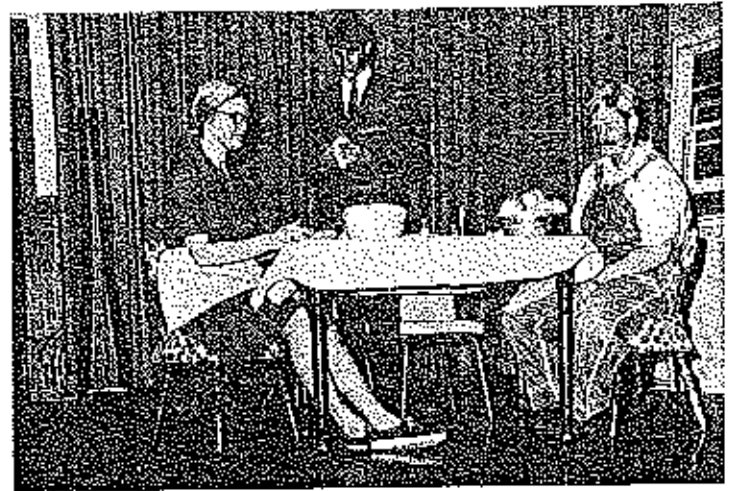

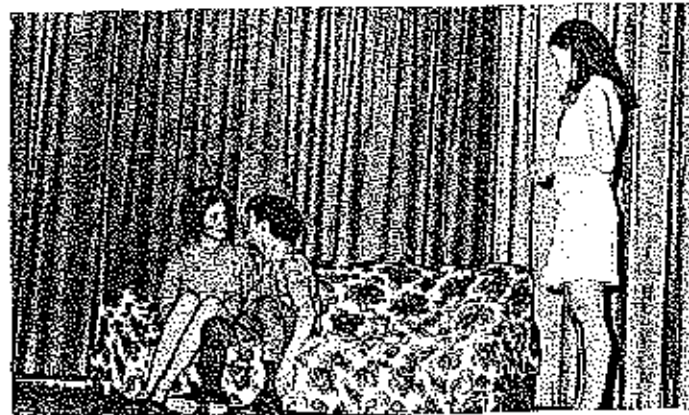

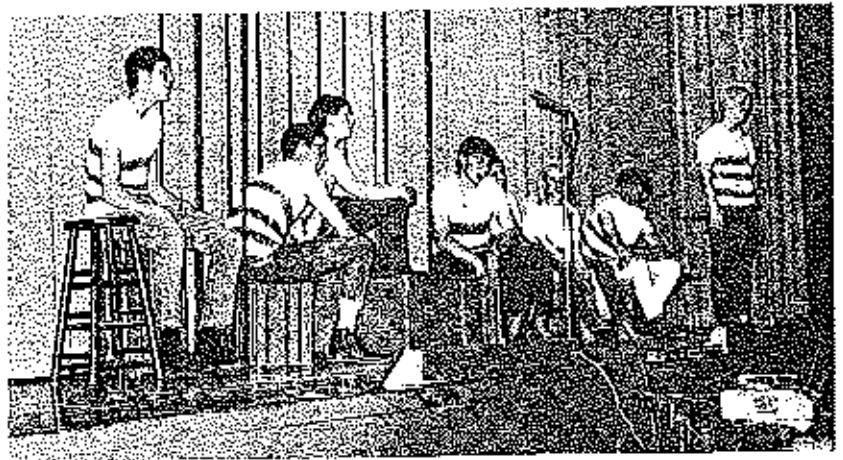

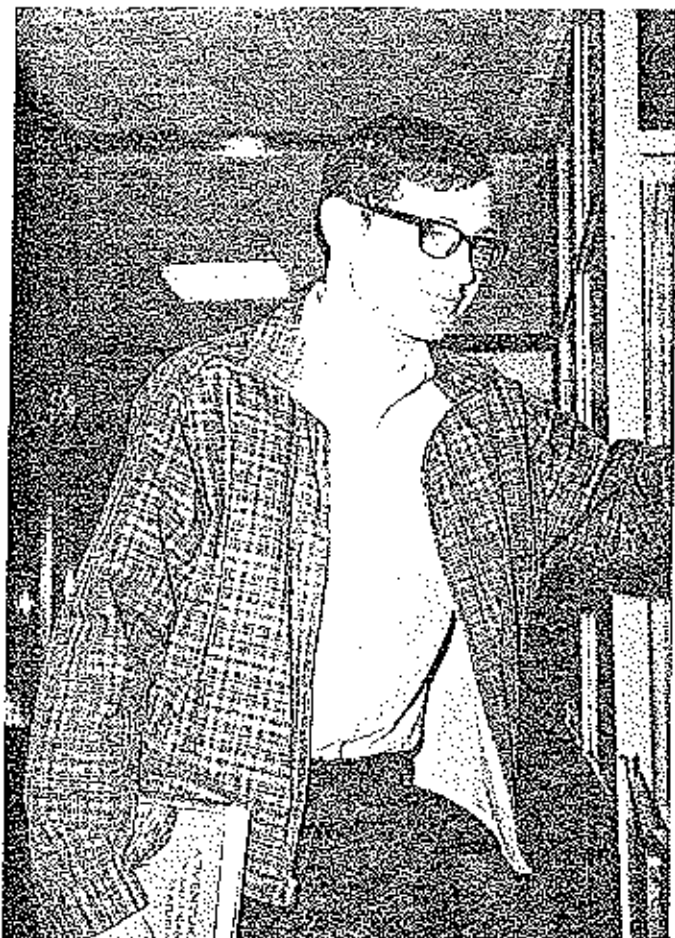

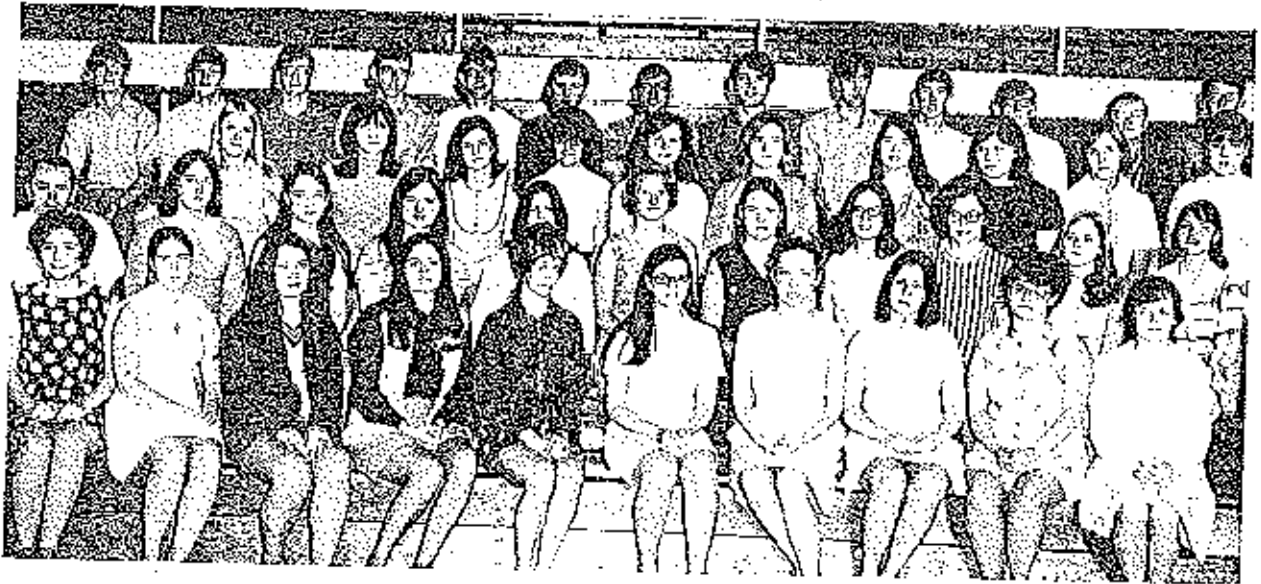

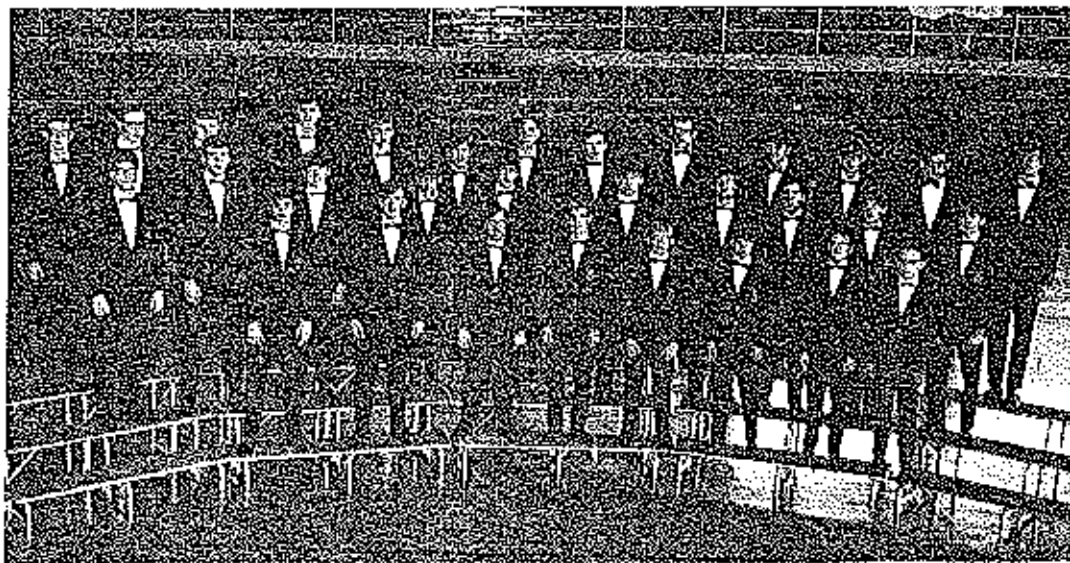

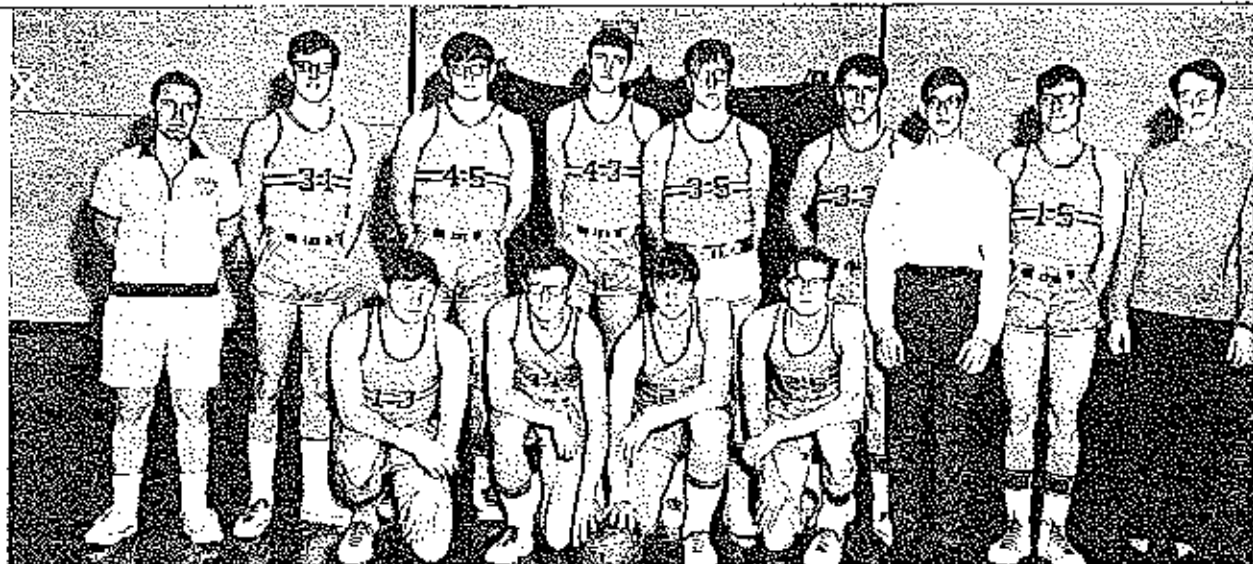

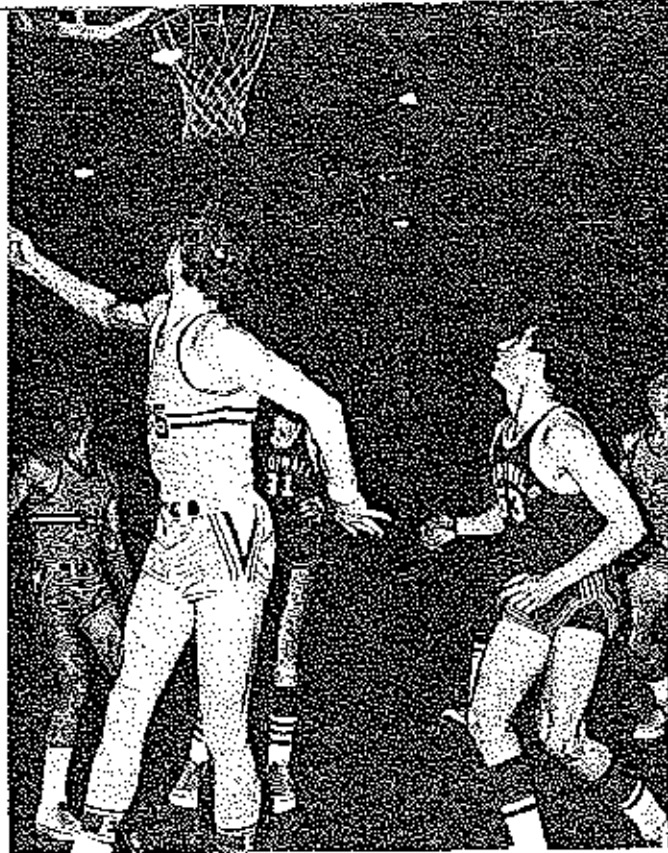

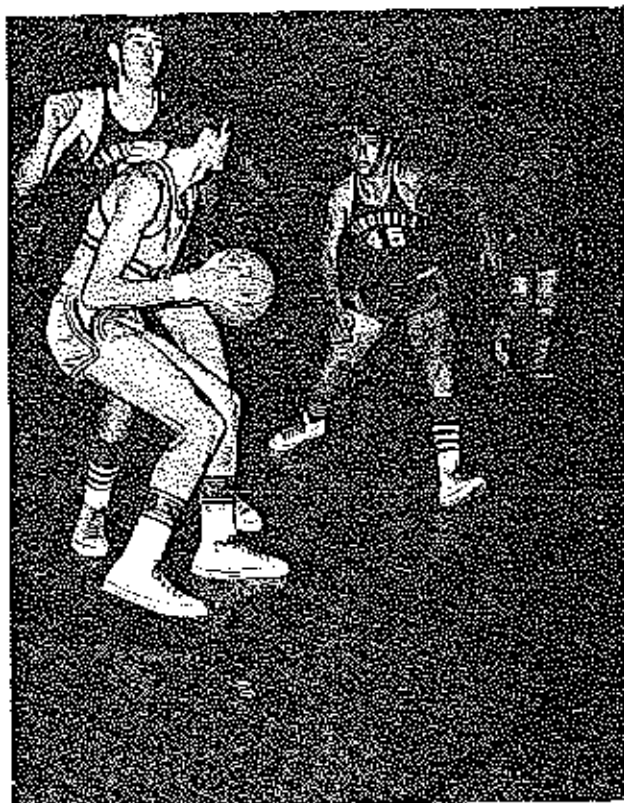

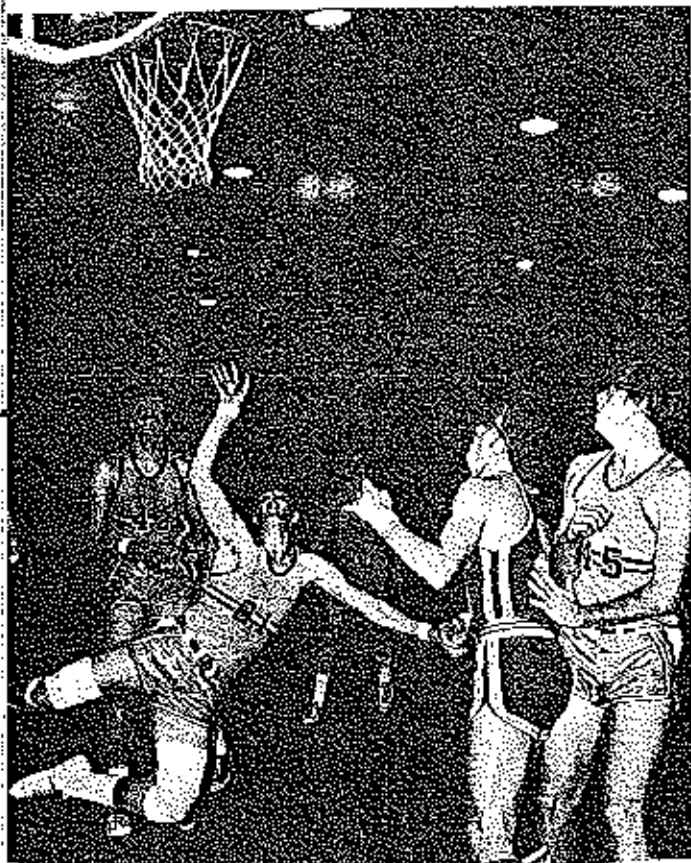

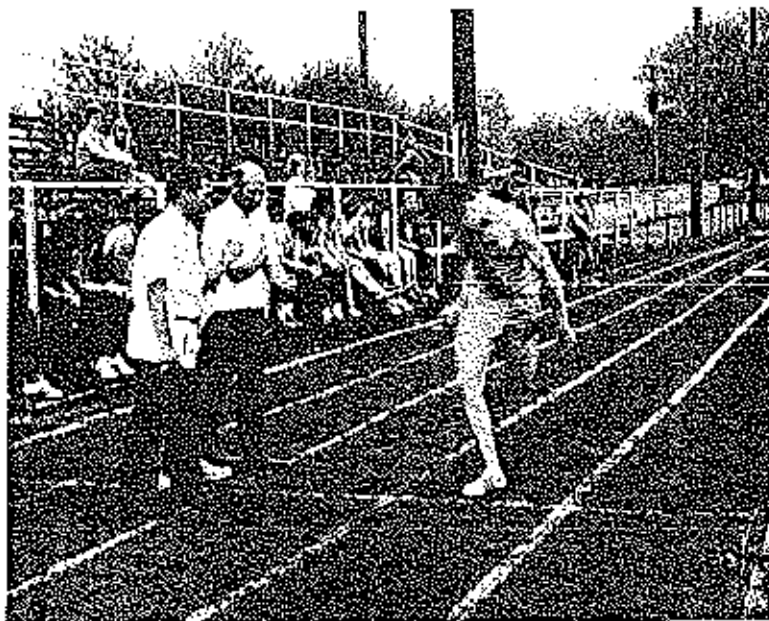

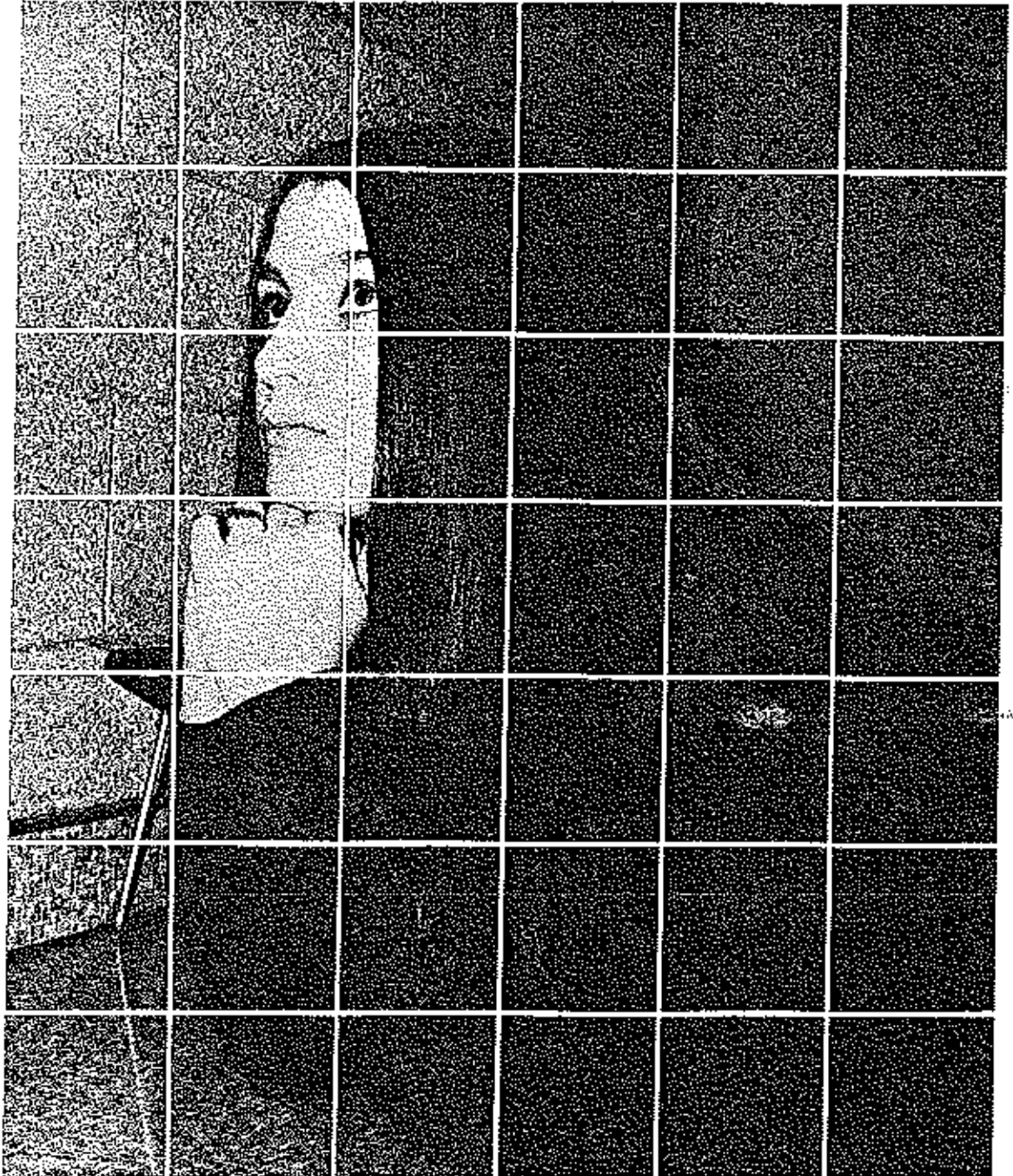

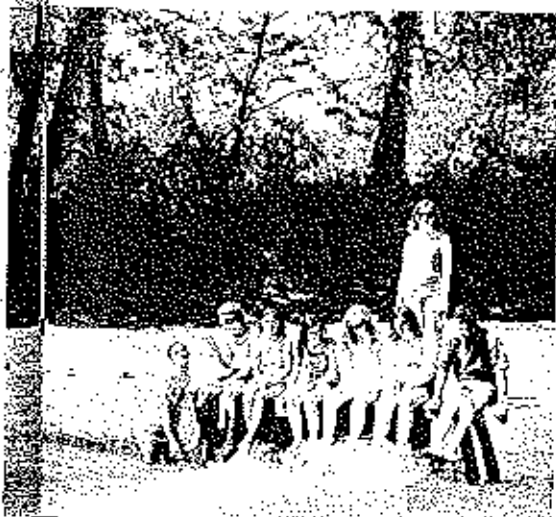

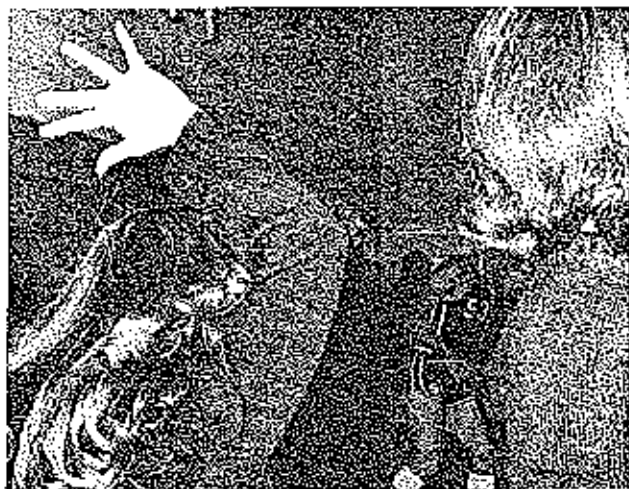

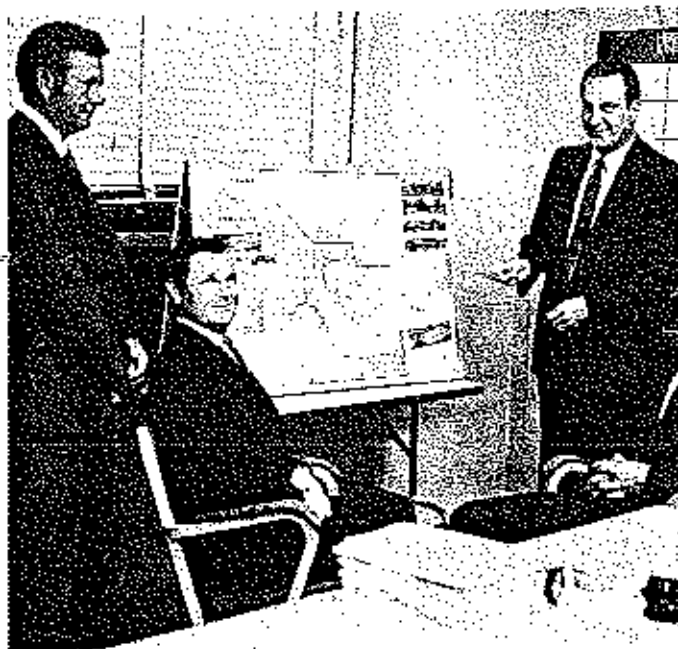
