



## foreword



## dedication




# homecoming activities

# christmas assembly


The E.H.S. music, dramatics, and speech departments joined efforts to present the annual Christmas assembly. It was one of our most outstanding.











# maroon and gold




## afs






## girl's athletic association


## e.h.s. golf team finishes 2nd in tri-county









Larry Rains (43) reaches high to score two points against Camdenton.




All eyes are glued to the loose ball in the game with Tipton.



Gail Jones (21) flips the ball upward in an acquired position.








