# board of education and administration expand curriculum



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
## new "mini conferences" instituted by counselors; vo. ed. bridges gap.





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
## students learn to communicate; and appreciate literature



#### football '71-'72 — a year to build








# coe has two state deca officers


# music department has an active year


# mustangs take tri-county championship













# peggy opië crowned queen of popularity & beauty

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

# pep club and cheerleaders promote school spirit


The pep club's major purpose is to develop a wholesome school spirit and a loyalty to our school and team regardless of the outcome of the game. Their efforts were well rewarded this year.



Mrs. Hines filled the art display case and art room with posters, handicrafts, portraits, and landscape paintings.



The Home Economics Department provided the viewers with refreshments. Cookies and punch were plentiful while the student's projects were examined.


The Science Department performed several demonstrations throughout the evening. Students tested water for poliution and dissected a frog.
