


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
board of education and administration

board of education plans construction of new junior high facility

The Board of Education is generally responsible for the quality of the educational program offered to the students of Eldon High, Members specify the quality of the teaching staff and other employees, the size of classes, and the nature of the facilities available to both teachers and students.

The Board of Education's main project this year has been the planning of a new Eldon junior high school building to be located across from the Eldon Cometary on CC. The building should house grades five through eight, reserving the central site for expansion of the high school and technical school programs. The old high school building will be demolished. The new building will be made large enough to accomodate the ninth grade in the event that Eldon continues to expand.

Harley Vaughn served as school board president until his resignation in February, Reger Shepherd was appointed to fill his vacancy until the spring school board election.



students council tapes record history of 73-74 school activities


The Eldon student council planned many activities for this year. Each month a student council member made a taped recording of the school activities. These recordings were played once a month on the local radio station.







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language arts dept. selects new curriculum






p.e. classes study drug abuse


This year the boys' and girls' physical education classes had a combined unit of drug study. Outside speakors were invited to talk with students and show films about alcohol and drug abuse.

The boys' instruction included wrestling, basketball, volleyball, and prison ball. The boys enjoyed student teacher Coach Cline in the winter session.





school spirit at all time high



The assembly program also included several pep railies throughout the year. With the use of several interesting "firsts," this year's pop railies generated much student enthusiasm and class competition.










juniors participate in mythical governmental politics




track team sets new tri county conference relay record



hit song "color my world" sets theme for 73-74 prom night




