As scheduled at 7:49 a.m. Gary Gilmore was executed by a firing squad; his final wish was accomplished at the same time that students began filling the high school for class.



Cookies and punch were served in the Home Economics room. Here, sewing projects that the girls had completed were shown. Needlepoint and other various handicrafts were also displayed.




Boys' Basketball


Boys' Track





Golf


The COE members had a first place winner at the National DECA Contests (which is a first for Eldon High School students). Kevin George placed First in Petroleum Managing and Ownership.






