# FROZEN TIME

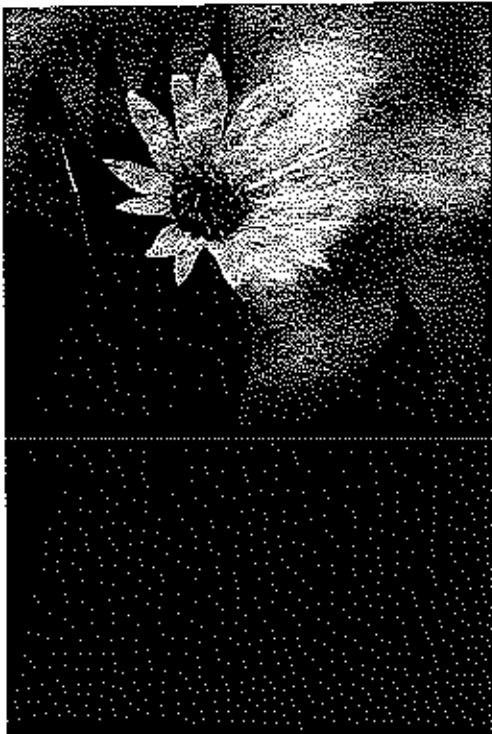

Most of them were oblivious as to what was happening at Salt Lake City Prison.

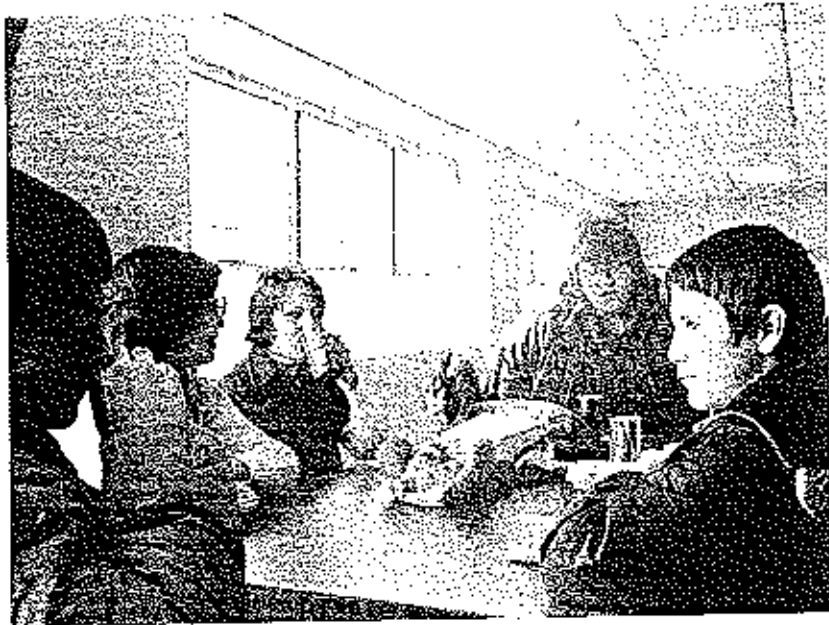

In the student lounge the juke-box spurs tunes and feet unconsciously moving with the beat. Faces are either studious or blantly carefree.

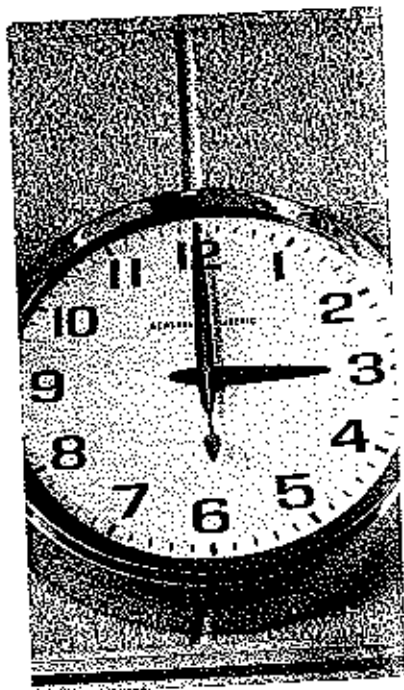
The afternoon is over. Five minutes before dismissal, students begin creeping around, quietly opening their lockers and shoving books in.

REFERET staff members selected the book's theme -- Frozen Time -- early in the year and Mother Nature cooperated by dumping several feet of snow on the nation. Photographers and staff members worked to revolve their ideas around the theme.

EHS publications tried to be both student voices and informers. Both staffs accepted and enjoyed the challenge.



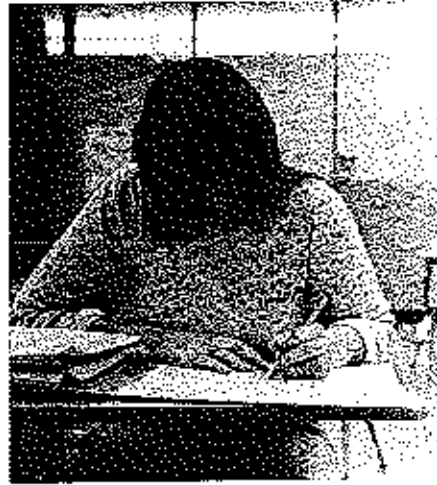

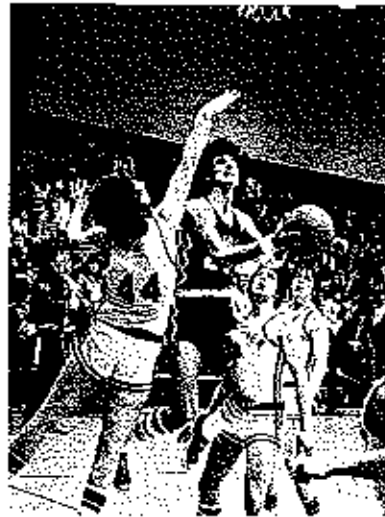

# Open House

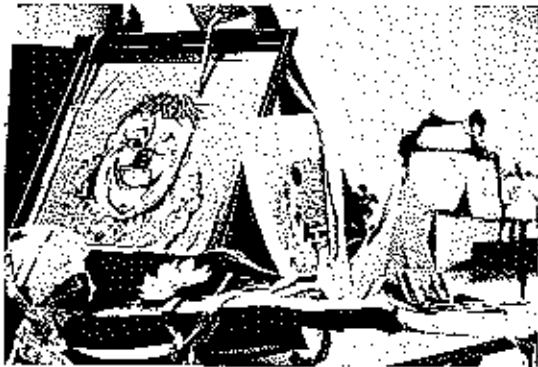
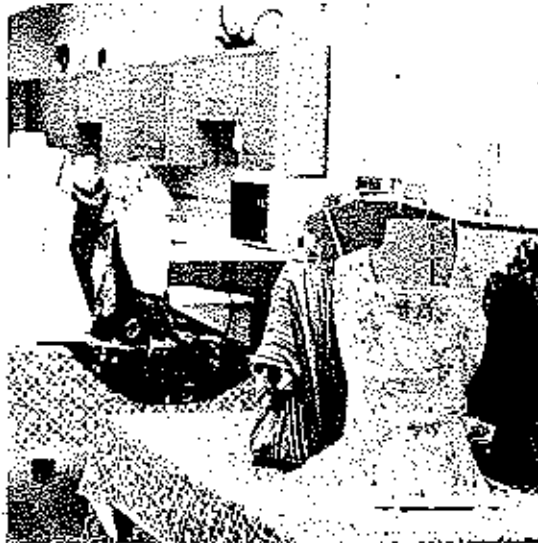
This year's open house, on May 20, gave EHS students an opportunity to display their work to the public. Music flowed through the rooms as parents and other interested spectators observed the exhibits.

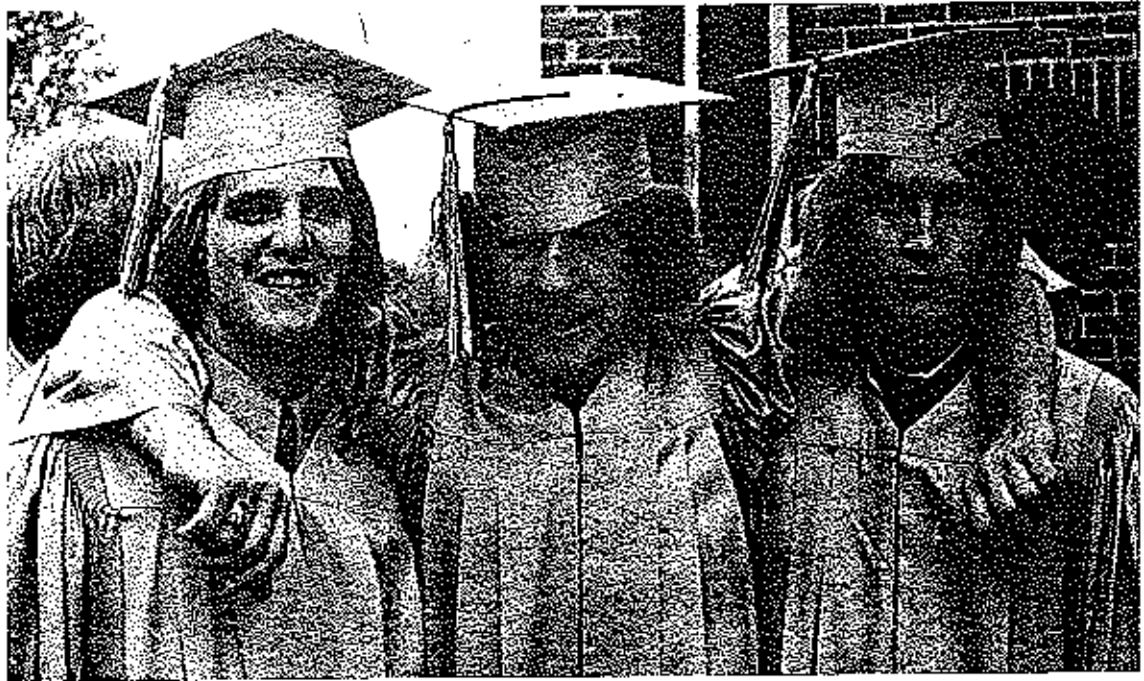
Cookies and punch were served in the Home Economics room. Here, sewing projects that the girls had completed were shown. Needlepoint and other various handicrafts were also displayed.

The Special Education class displayed clothing and decoupage projects.

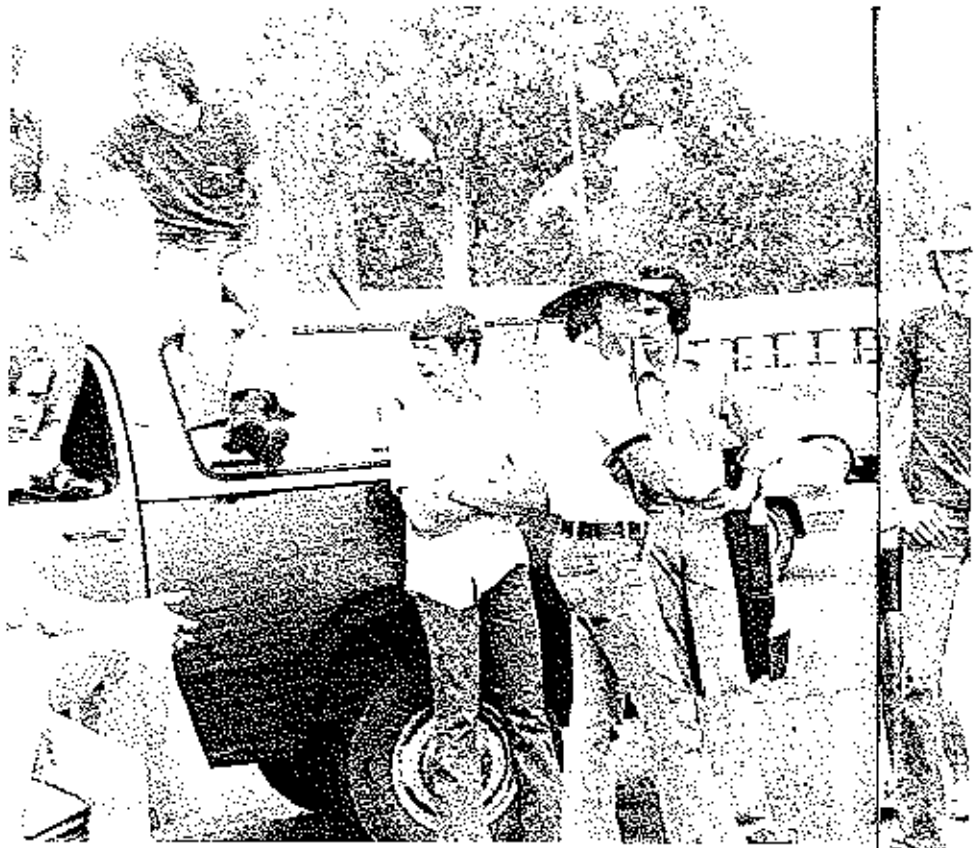

The "Skeleton Dance" was done by JoKaren Hammond and Anita Kelly to represent Halloween pointing out the season of fall.

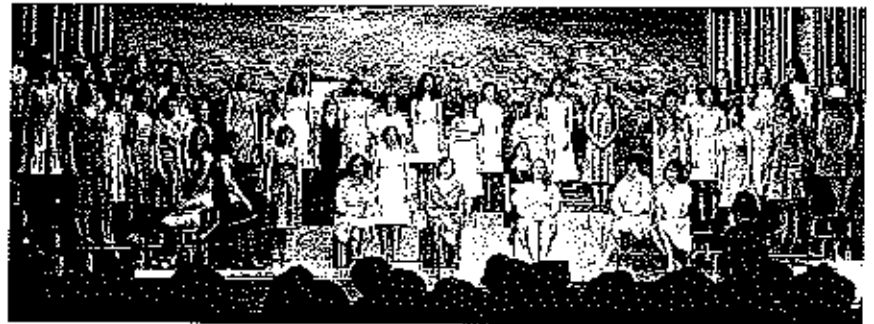
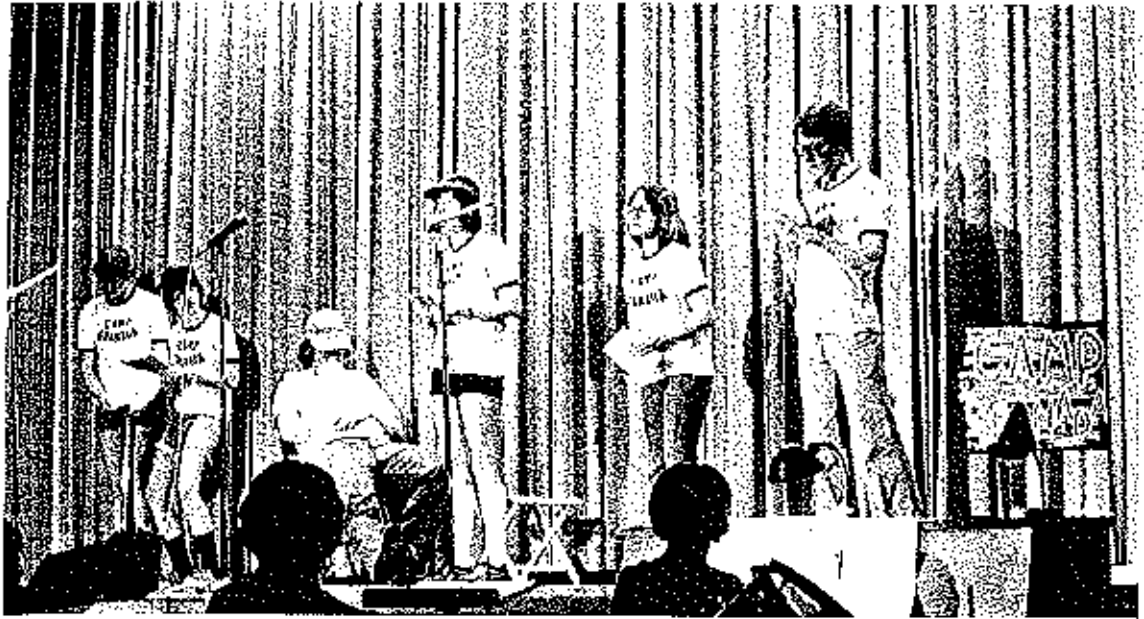
Freshmen caroled Christmas songs in an introduction to "Beautiful Saviour", a candlelight number performed by the mixed chorus.

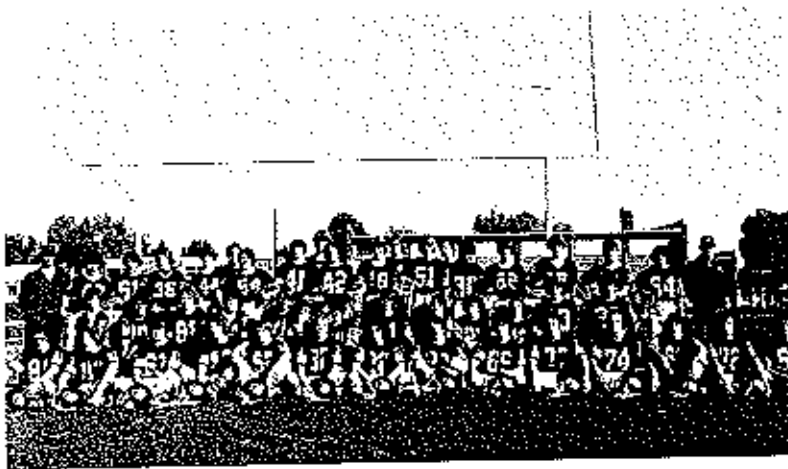
## Seven named all-conference

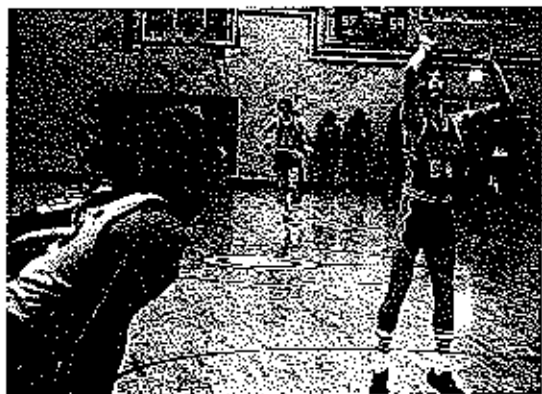


# Boys' Basketball

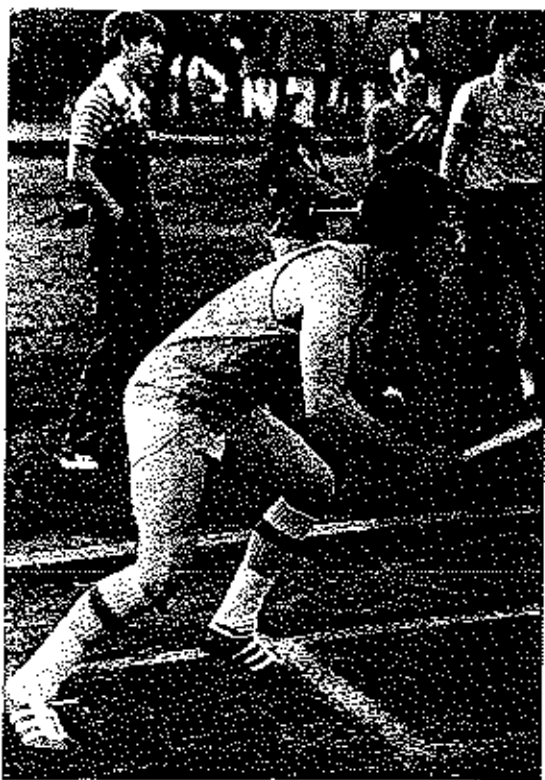
# Boys' Track

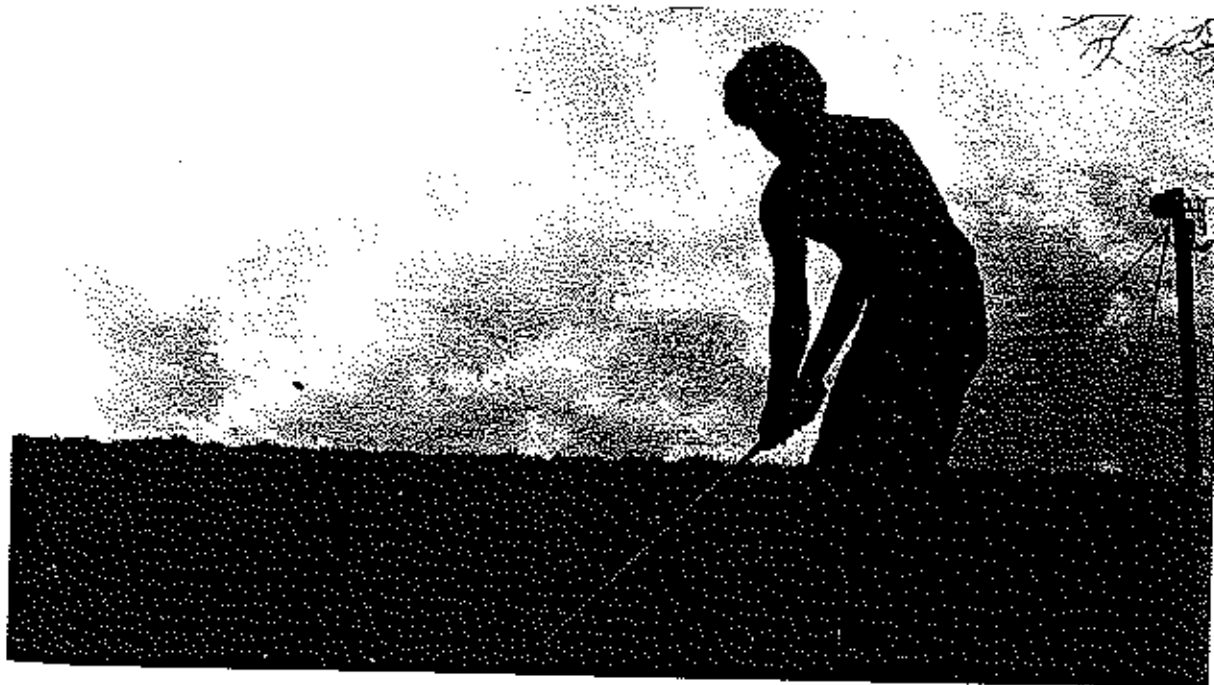

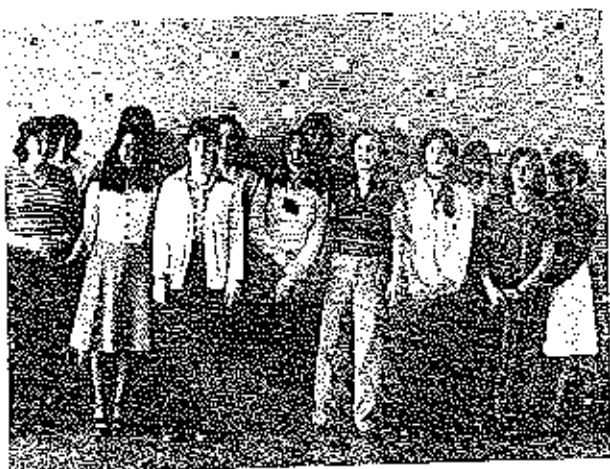
The COE members had a first place winner at the National DECA Contests (which is a first for Eldon High School students). Kevin George placed First in Petroleum Managing and Ownership.

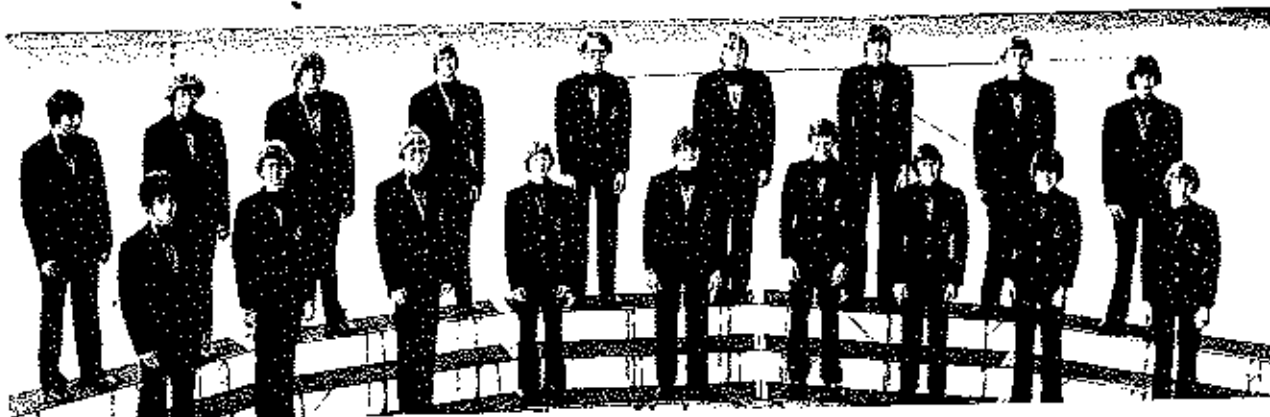
