






EHS Action







The parade got everyone into the spirit for the game.





The great flood drove many people out of their homes. Many people tried to stay in their houses as long as possible, but excitually 25,000 had to be eyecuated.



Michael Jordan announced his retirement at a press conference in Deerfield, Illinois. "I've always stressed that when I lose the sense of motion and the sense to prove something as a basketball player," he said, "it's time to leave."

The Michael Jordan cra began when he entered the NBA as the number three draft pick. This was the beginning of a nine year career with the Chicago Bulls.

Jordan became known for his outstanding defence and made the All-Defense first team for fix years. This effectiveness might be partly due to his trash talking. One of his favorite sayings is: "You're are about to get all education. You're going to flight school."



James Jordan 1937-1993

James Jordan, Michael Jordans father, was attacked on July 22, 1993, by eighteen-yearolds, Larry Martin Demery and Daniel Audrey Green, Jordan had pulled over to the side of Route 74 near Lumberton, N.C., to rest before finishing his four hour drive home to Charlott. One of the boys shot Jordan in the chest with a .38 caliber bullet and then they damped his body in a swamp just over the South Carolina line. Green and Demery drove Jordan's red Lexus, a gift from Michael, for a few days and then abandoned it. Authorities track the calls made from the car's cellular phone which led them to Denicry and Green.

Pop's, Michael's name for his father, was laid to rest at a private ceremony on August 15 at a church in Teachey, N.C. Posswas known for cracking jok in the Bulls' locker room, accompanying the team on road trips and appearing in a commercial with his son. James Jordans will be remembered for the joy and pride he had in being Michael's father.







These were only a few of Fl²A's activities this year. FFA stays very busy being one of Eldon High School's most active organizations.








Talents Shine in Spotlight






Mustangs Carry On Tradition




Golf 'Swings' Into Action








FHA Fun City draws crowd





and Planet Hollywood.




After all the speeches were completed, Superintendent, Dr. Howard Neeley presented each student their diploma.

After the tassles were turned and the caps were tossed, the class of 1994 exit Eldon High School and make their entrance into the real world..




