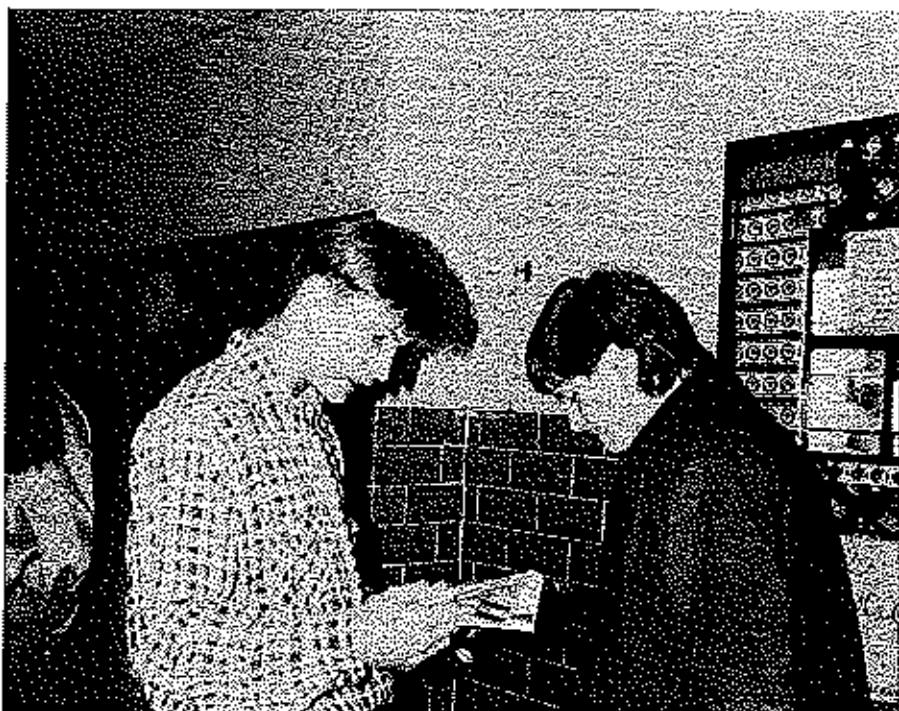

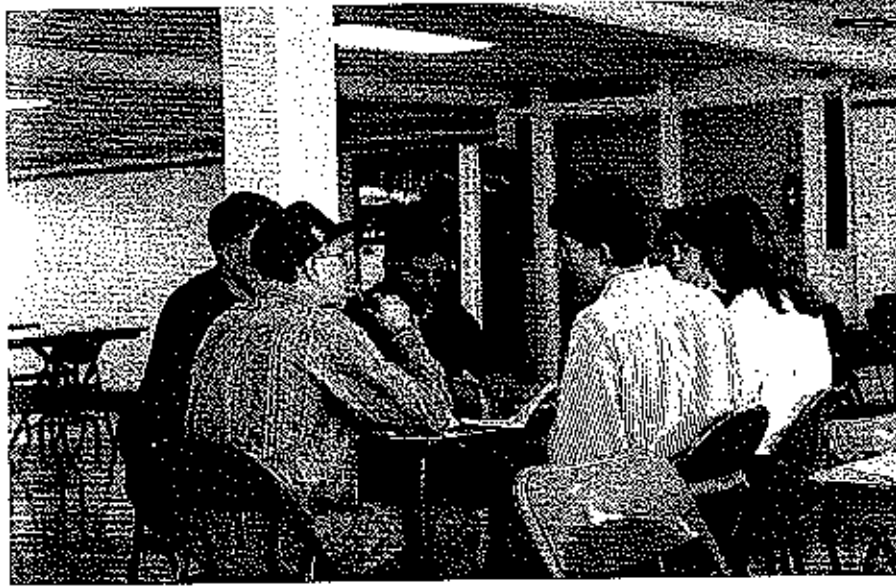

The annual EHS fall Homecoming Parade took place on October 5, 1993. The EHS Marching Band was first in line of participants.

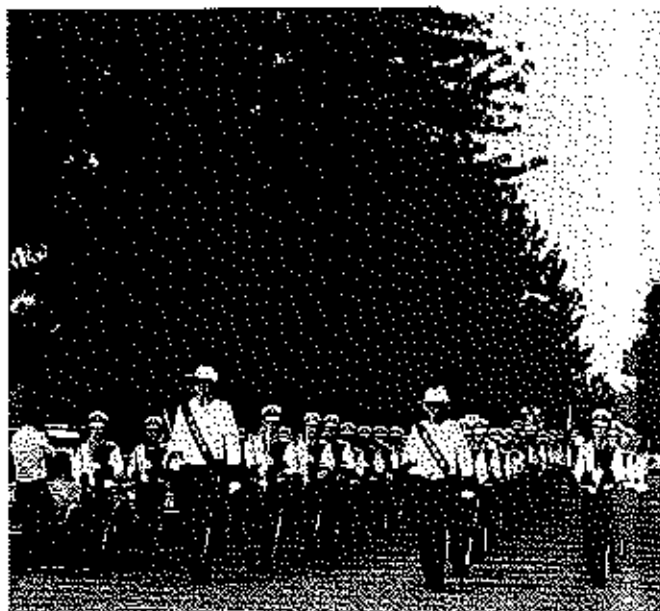

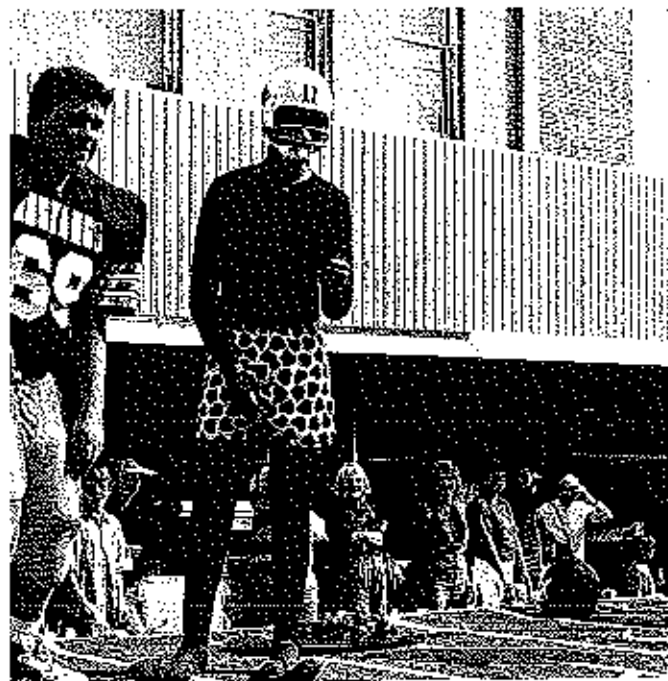

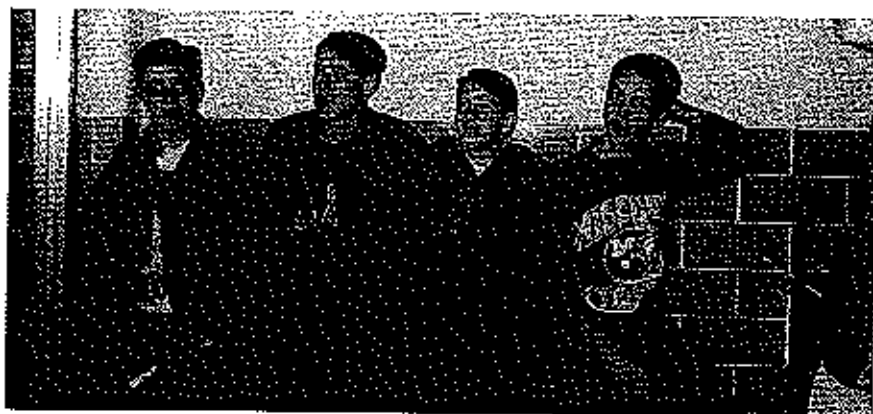

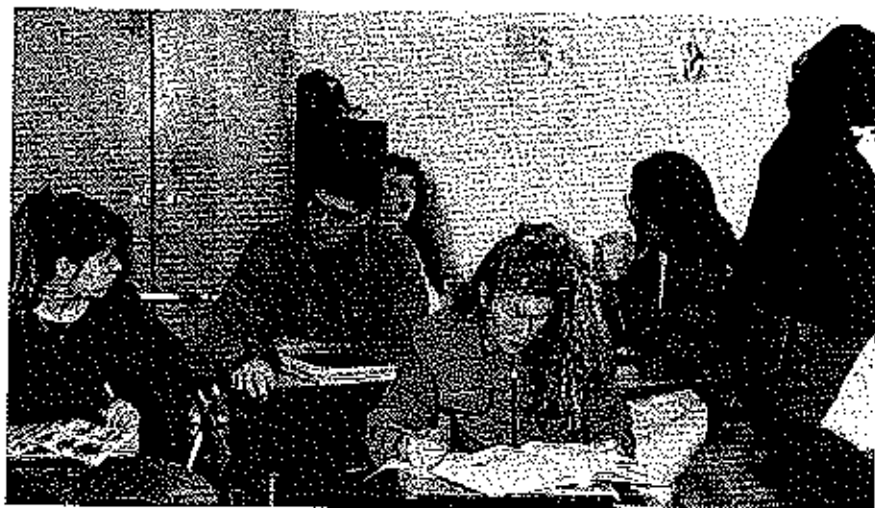

Flood of '93 Causes Disaster

The great flood drove many people out of their homes. Many people tried to stay in their houses as long as possible, but eventually 25,000 had to be evacuated.

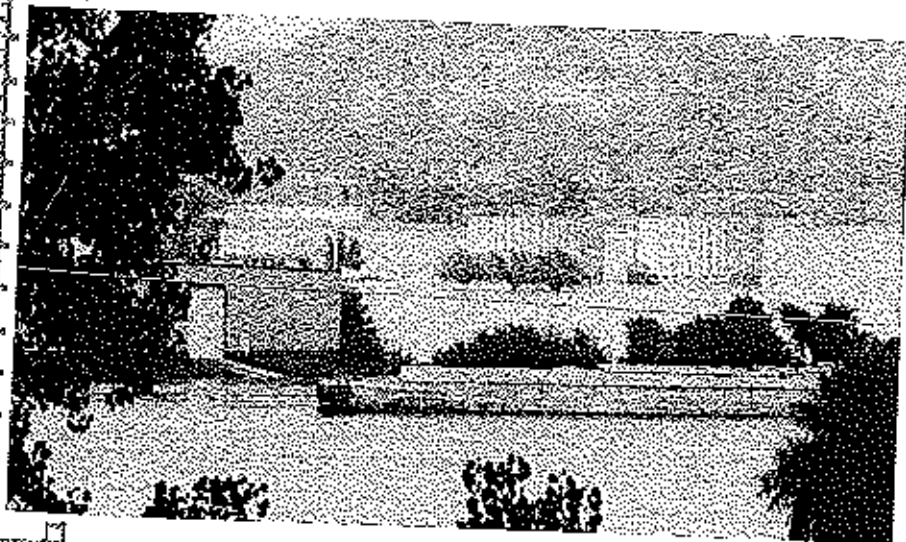
Among the many injuries,

there were 24 people killed. There were so many homes and buildings destroyed that the total damage came up to about 3 billion dollars.

The flood caused the flood stage of the Missouri River to

crest at 38.6 feet. It reached that on July 30, which increased the previous record by 4 1/2 feet.

People are still working to restore their homes and are preparing for future storms like the tragic flood of 1993.

Many issues are still being discussed such as NAFTA, but for Clinton many more will come.

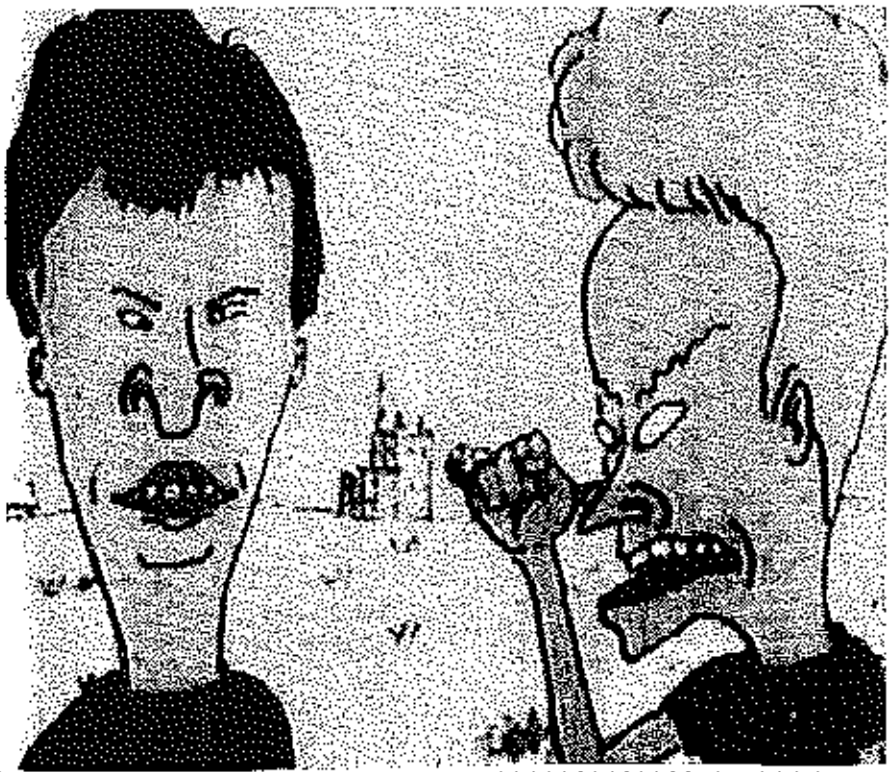
President, Bill Clinton, gives an important press conference to discuss the issues of the North American Foreign Trade Agreement, NAFTA.

Basketball Loses its "Air" and Baseball Loses its "Swing"



Michael Jordan

Basketball fans will remember the day of October 6, 1993, as the day they witnessed the end of a basketball career for one of the greatest players ever to step on the court. Michael Jordan announced his retirement at a press conference in Deerfield, Illinois. "I've always stressed that when I lose the sense of motion and the sense to prove something as a basketball player," he said, "it's time to leave."

The Michael Jordan era began when he entered the NBA as the number three draft pick. This was the beginning of a nine year career with the Chicago Bulls.

Jordan became known for his outstanding defence and made the All-Defense first team for six years. His effectiveness might be partly due to his trash talking. One of his favorite sayings is, "You're about to get an education. You're going to flight school."

Jordan defied the laws of gravity as he created slam dunks that were unimaginable.

Before Jordan, no one had made such an impact on all aspects of the game. There are no words to describe Jordan but he will always be a legend to those who appreciated the game.



George Brett

George Brett announced his retirement on September 25, 1993, at a news conference at Royals Stadium. Declaring that there was something missing from the game, Brett is now looking at the game from a different point of view. He is the Royals Vice-President of Baseball operations.

Brett is leaving the game with numerous records and achievements. He won three batting titles in three decades (1976, 1980, 1990). The first one was won at age twenty-three. Mostly known for his offense Brett was a lifetime .308 hitter with eleven

seasons over .300. Fans showed their appreciation for Brett's efforts by naming him to thirteen consecutive American League All-Star teams. One of Brett's personal favorite records is his twenty-one year service with one club, the Kansas City Royals.

Royals fans were praying for Brett to get a hit at his last at bat. George Brett hit a single, causing the home crowd of the Texas Rangers to give him a standing ovation. It was their way of letting him know they were proud to have a legend end their career in such a way at their stadium.

Tragic Losses of 1993

River Phoenix

1970-1993



Fans mourned the death of 23-year-old River Phoenix as Hollywood lost one of its hottest young actors on the night of October 31, 1993. Around 1:00 a.m., Phoenix was seen trembling in front of a sink in the bathroom of the Viper Room, a club on L.A.'s Sunset Strip. His shuddering failed to stop even after club goers threw cold water on his face. Phoenix was then helped outside the club. When he reached the sidewalk, he had numerous seizures. By the time Phoenix reached Cedars-

Sinai Medical Center at 1:34, the actor was in full cardiac arrest. At 1:51, River Phoenix was pronounced dead.

Currently, the cause of the death remains officially undetermined since the coroner's autopsy was "inconclusive."

In the days following his death, fans covered the sidewalk where Phoenix collapsed with flowers and glowing candles. Inscribed in blue and gold chalk on the street are the words, "The Eternal River."

James Jordan

1937-1993



James Jordan, Michael Jordans father, was attacked on July 22, 1993, by eighteen-year-olds, Larry Martin Demery and Daniel Audrey Green. Jordan had pulled over to the side of Route 74 near Lumberton, N.C., to rest before finishing his four hour drive home to Charlott. One of the boys shot Jordan in the chest with a .38 caliber bullet and then they dumped his body in a swamp just over the South Carolina line. Green and Demery drove Jordan's red Lexus, a gift from Michael, for a few days and then aban-

doned it. Authorities track the calls made from the car's cellular phone which led them to Demery and Green.

Pop's, Michael's name for his father, was laid to rest at a private ceremony on August 15 at a church in Teachey, N.C. Pop's was known for cracking jokes in the Bulls' locker room, accompanying the team on road trips and appearing in a commercial with his son. James Jordans will be remembered for the joy and pride he had in being Michael's father.

Student Council is one of the most active organizations at Eldon High School. They began the year by sponsoring the homecoming dance after the football game.

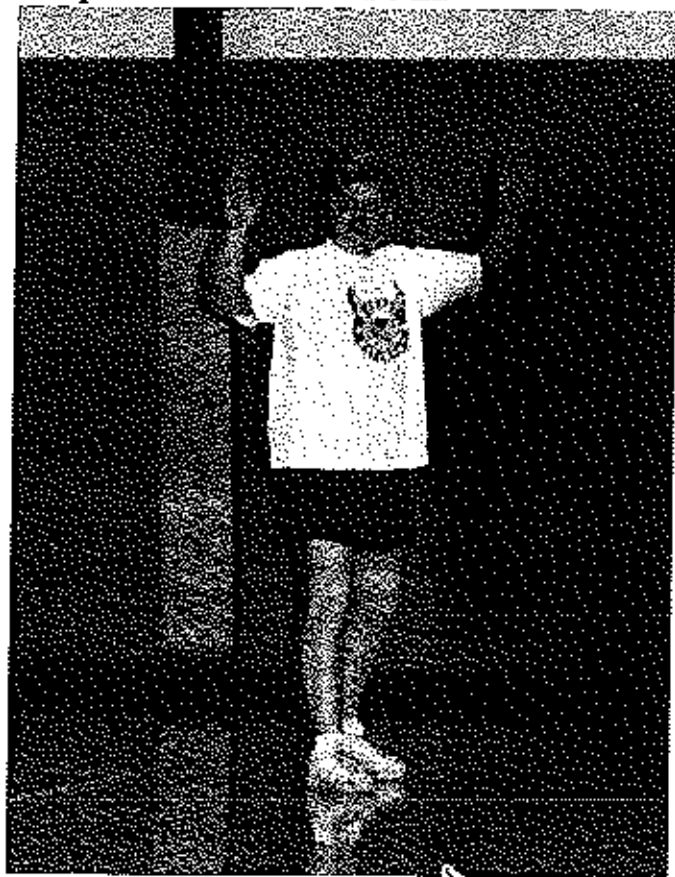
For Halloween they create a haunted house that is open to the rest

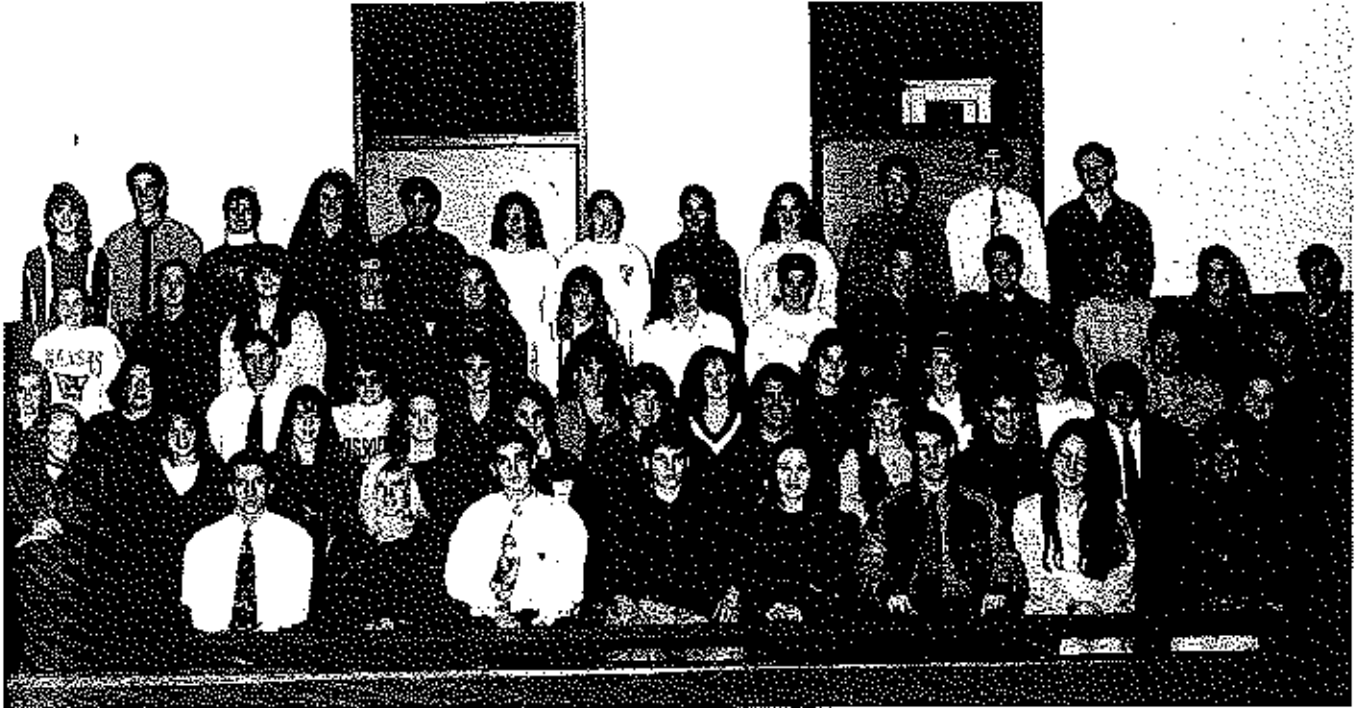

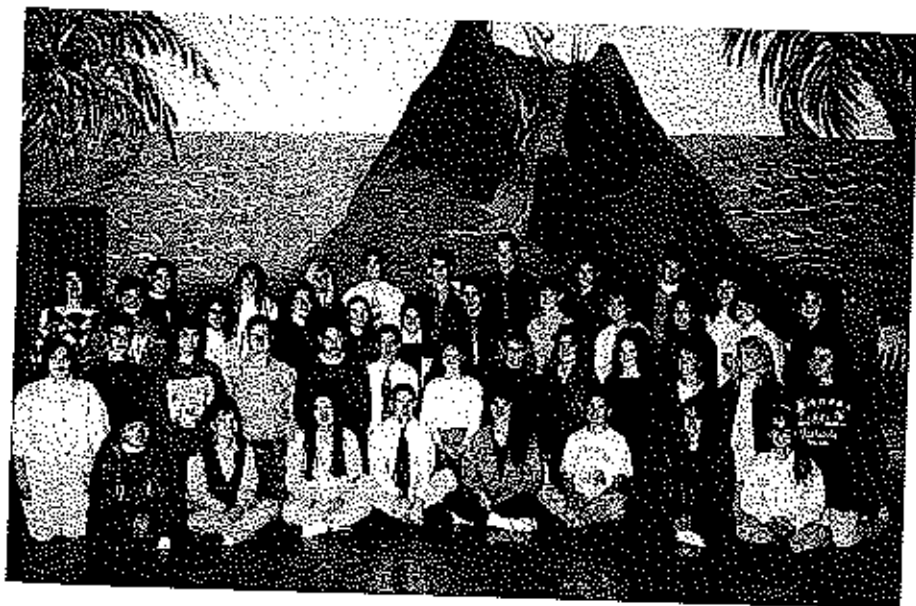

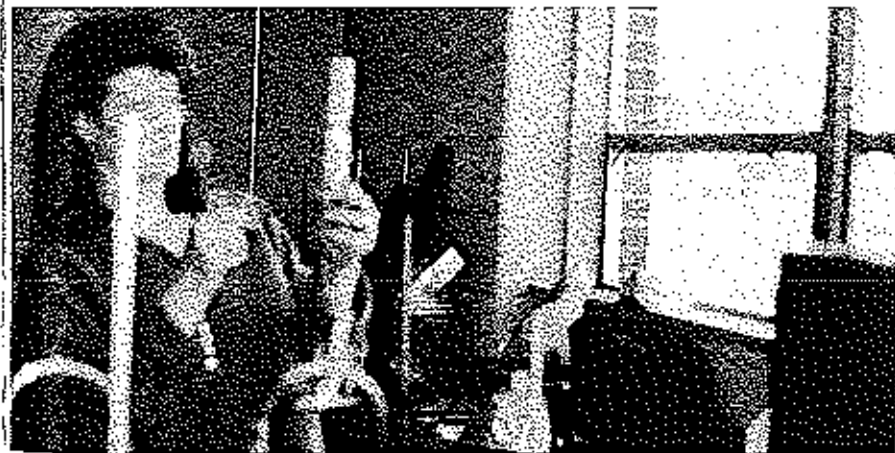

FFA PLOWS INTO NEW ACTION

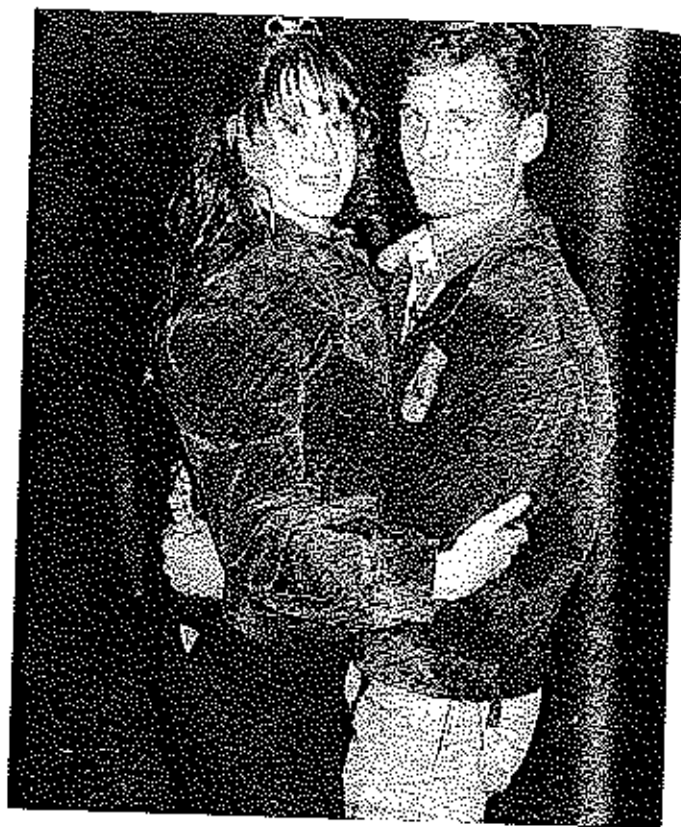

During the 1993-1994 school year, the Eldon FFA chapter had more than 150 members.

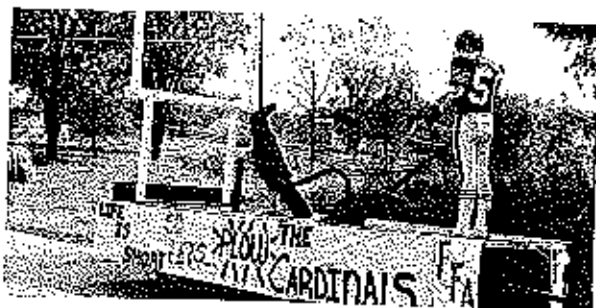
They celebrated National FFA week,

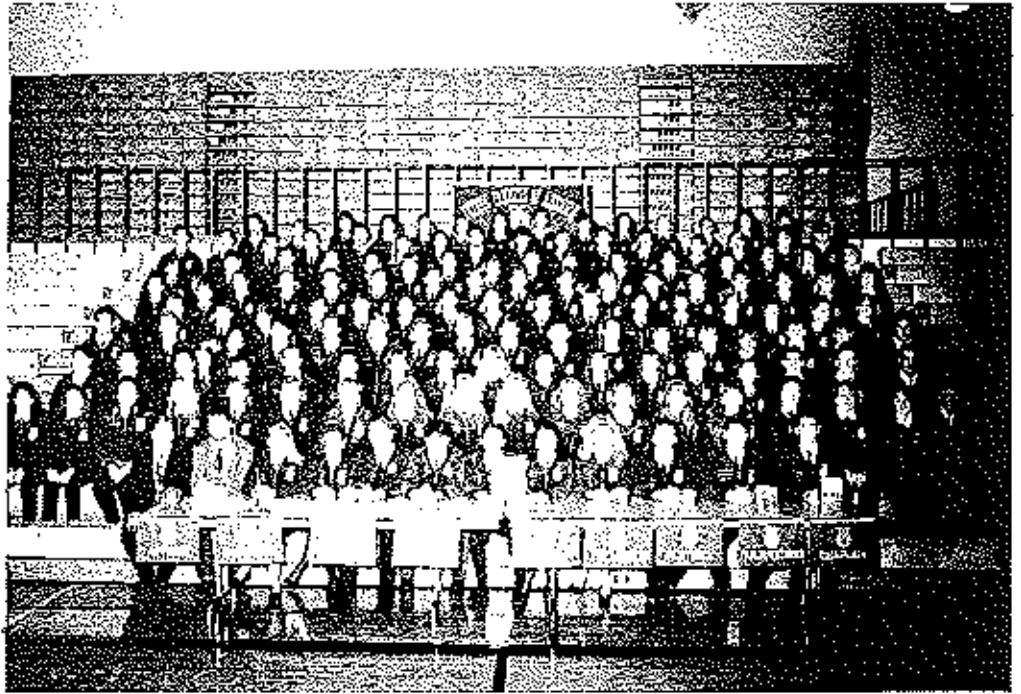

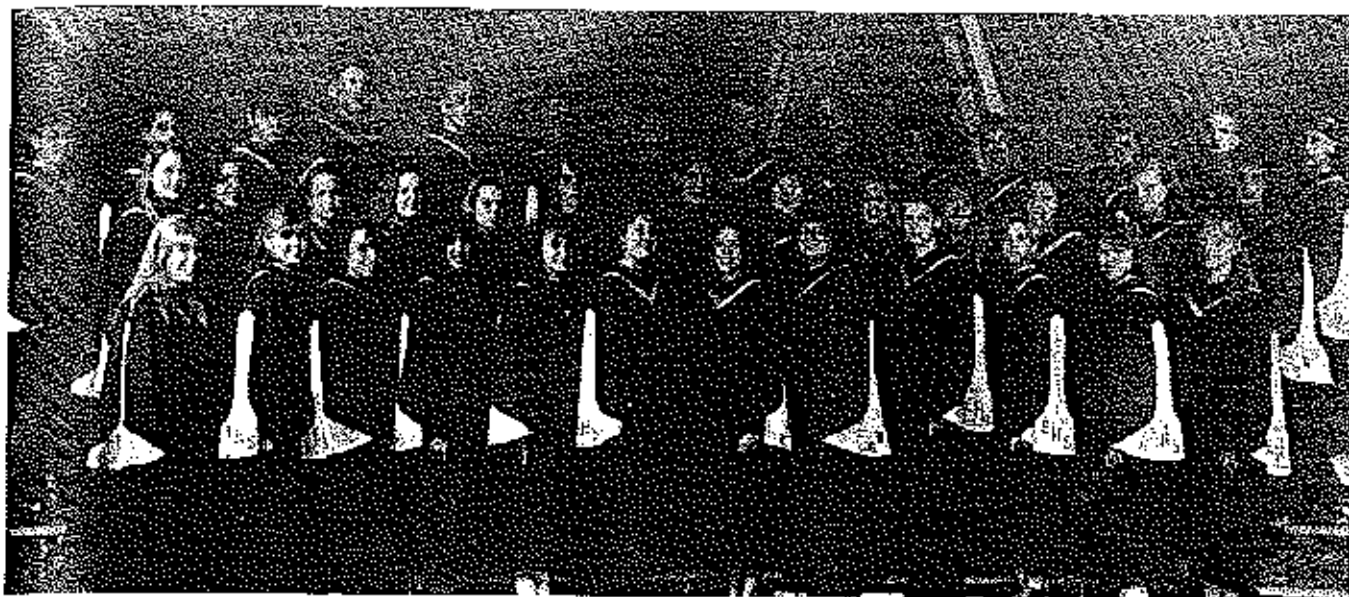

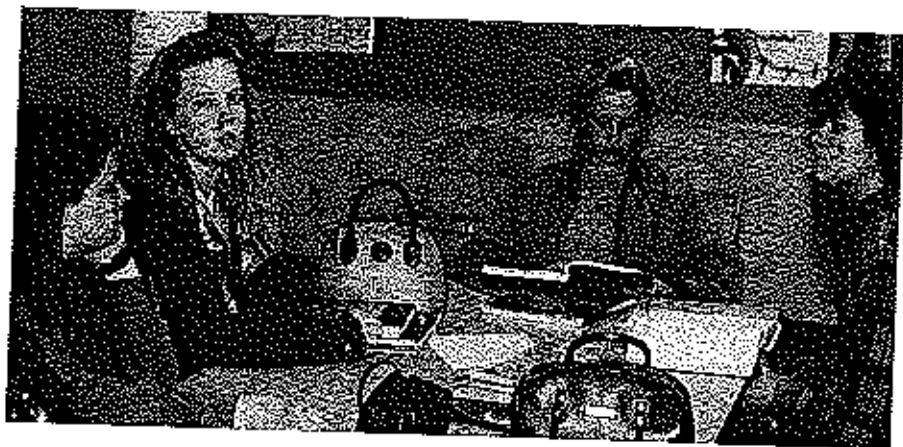

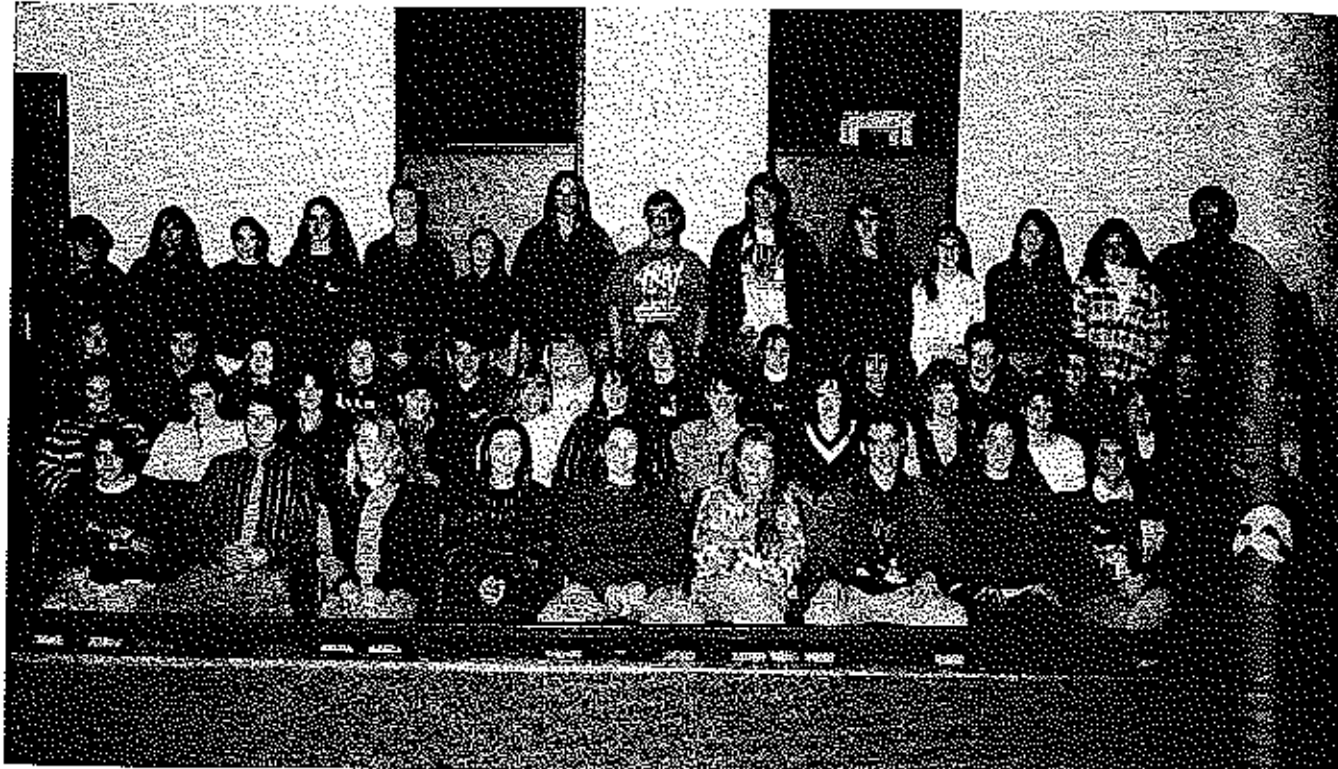

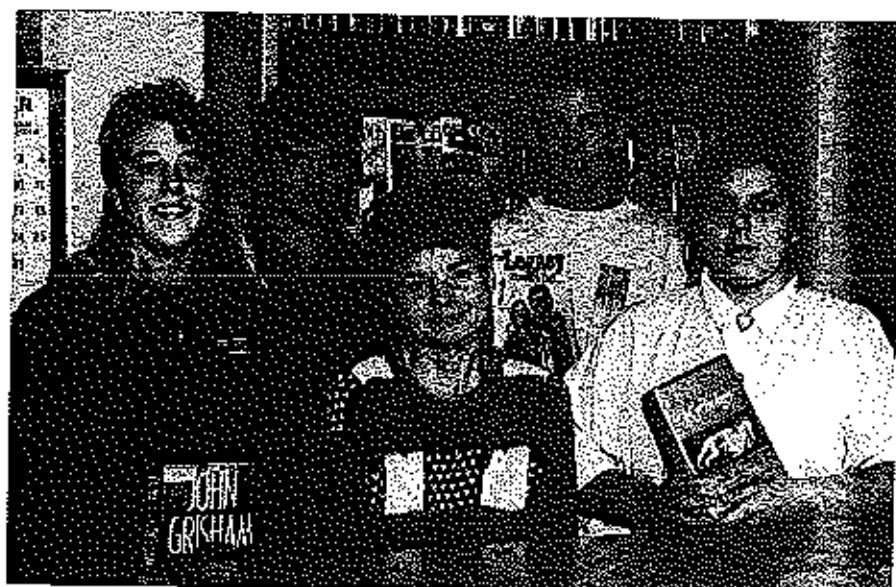

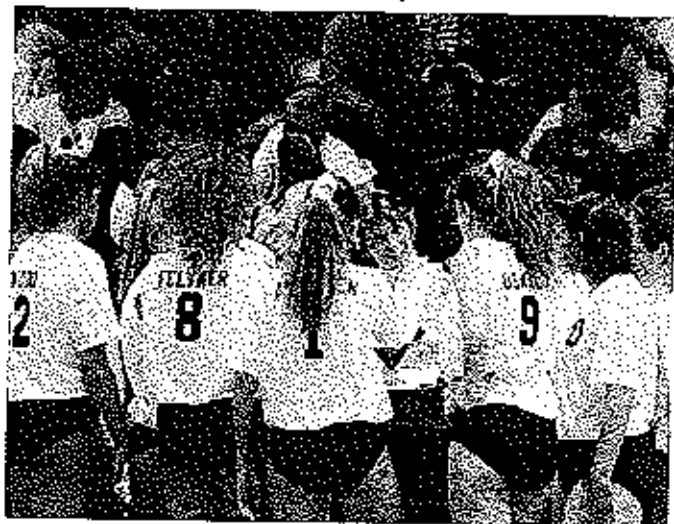

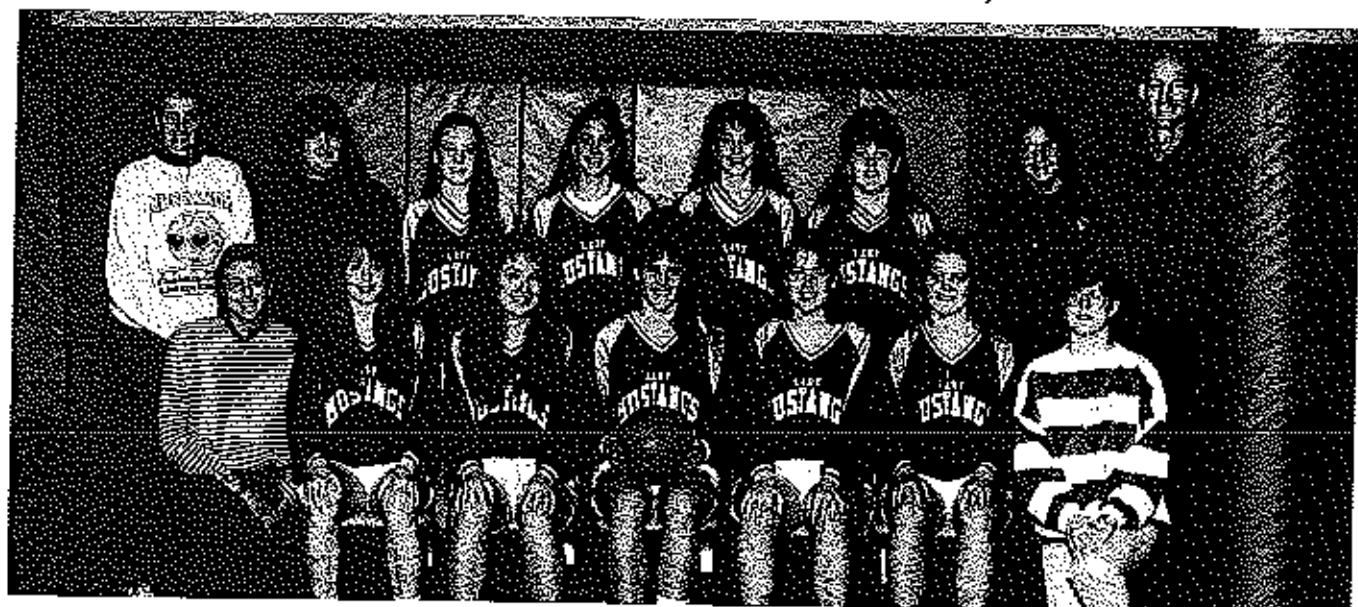

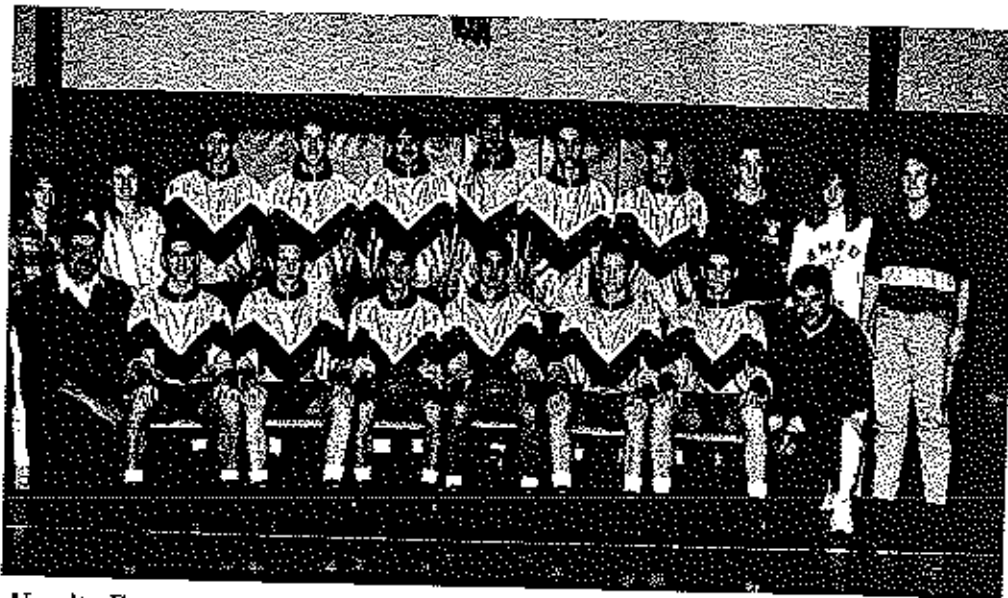
MUSTANGS CARRY ON TRADITION

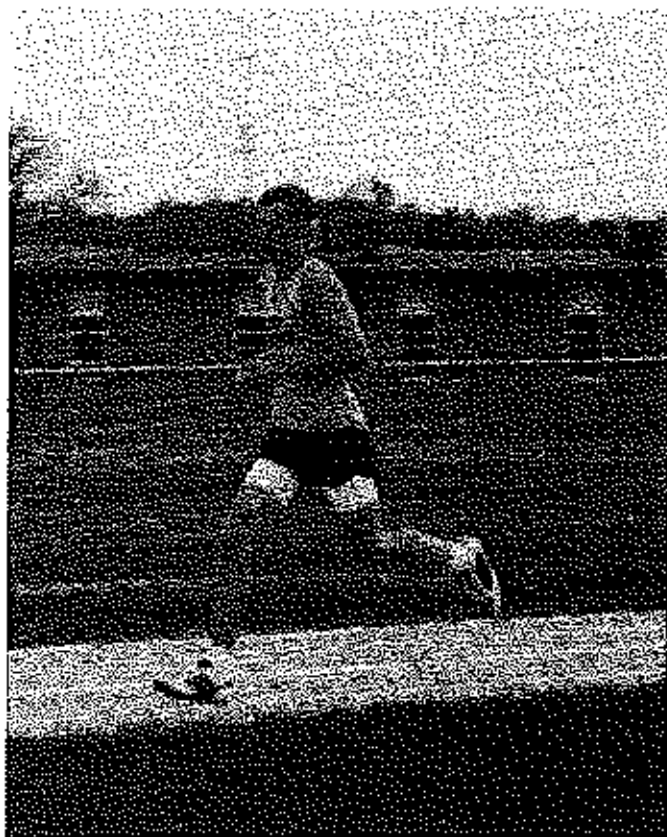

Golf 'Swings' Into Action

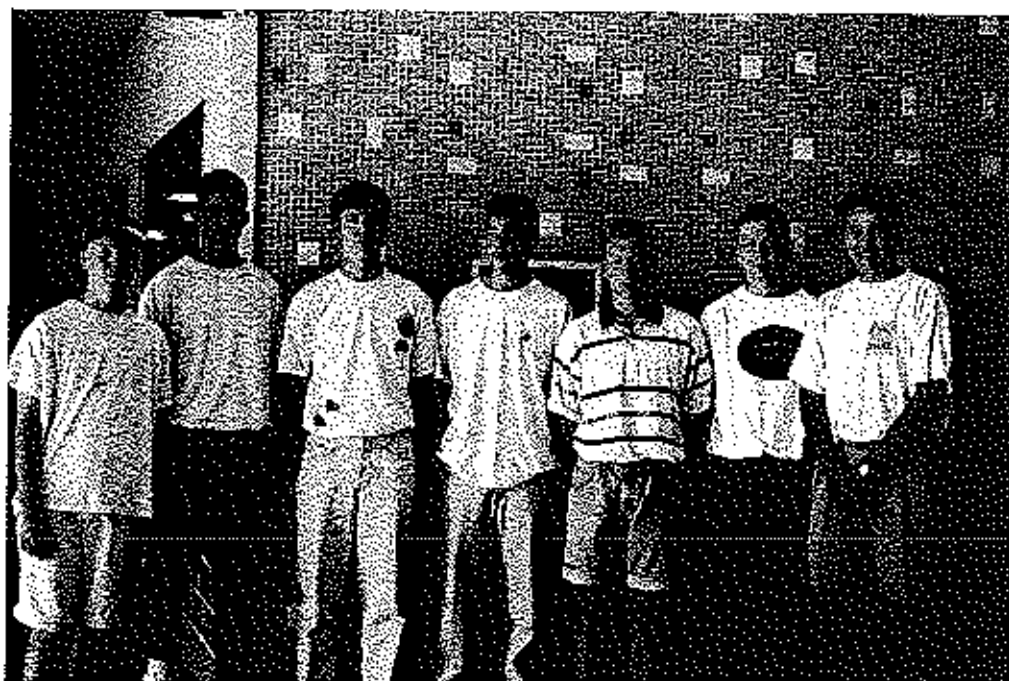

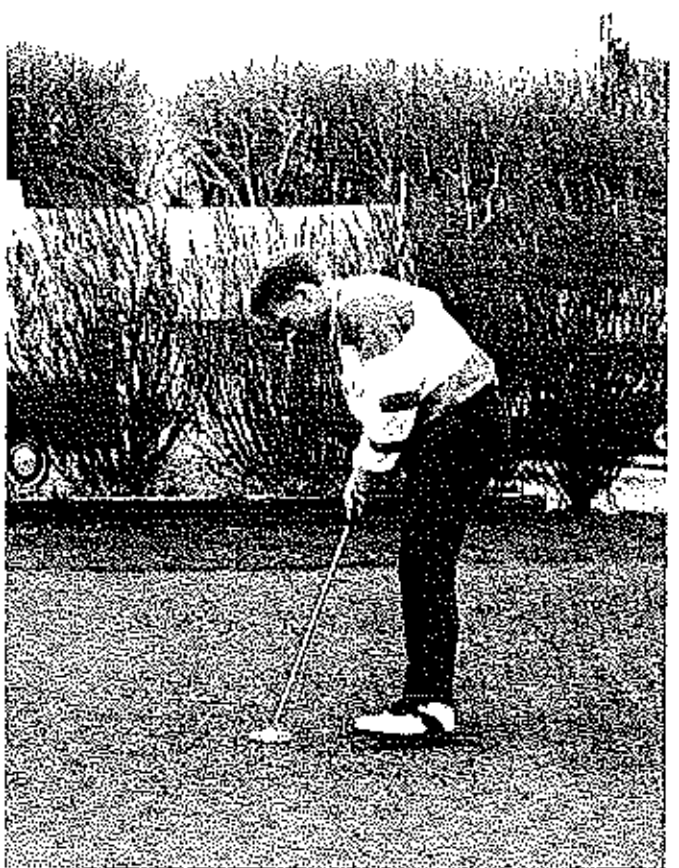

Votes are cast by putting money in each candidates jar. Each vote is one penny.

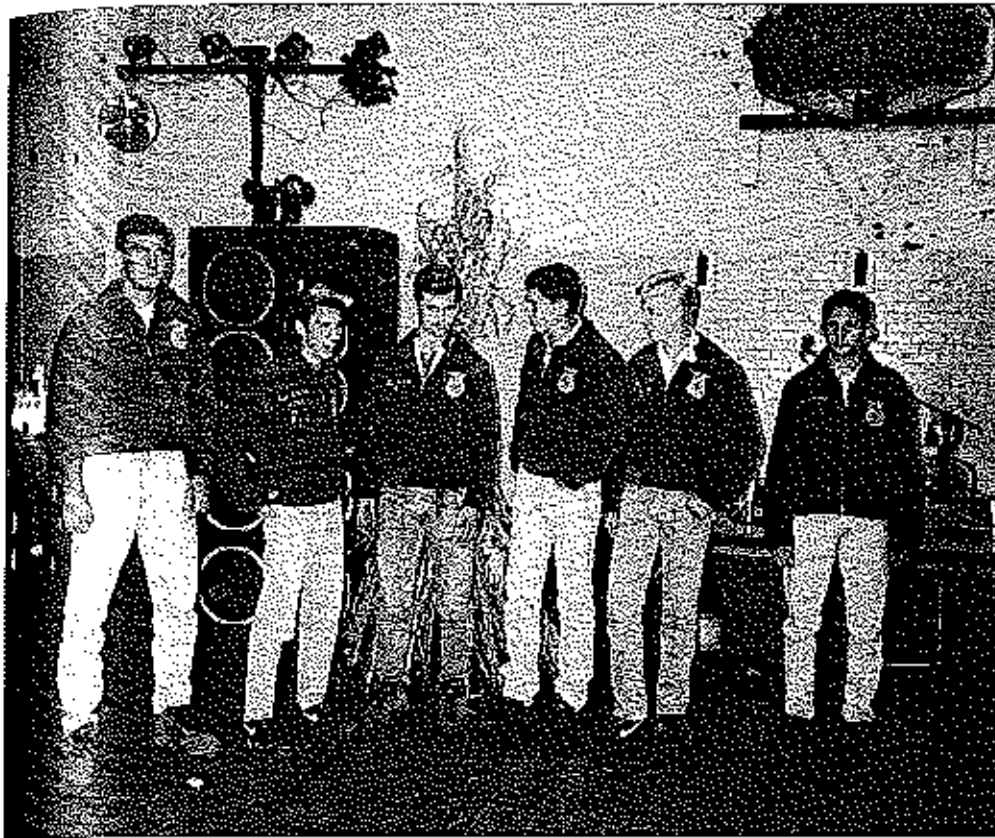
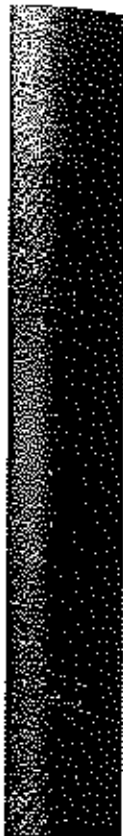

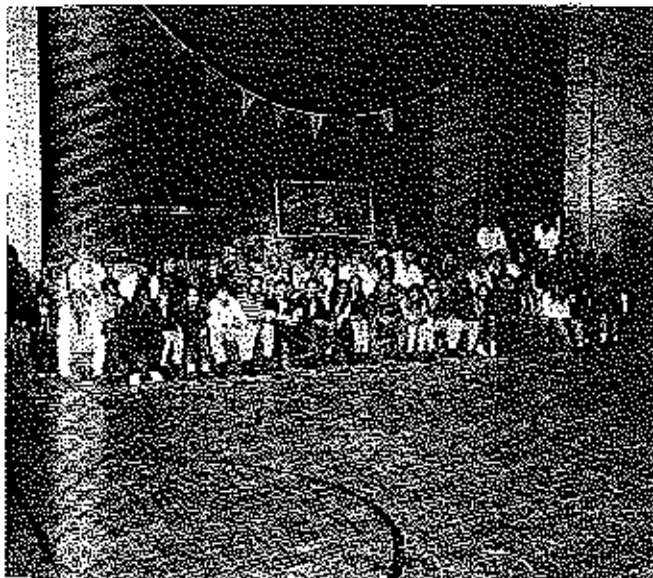

The members totally re-built the rooms in the tunnel to be as scary as they could be.

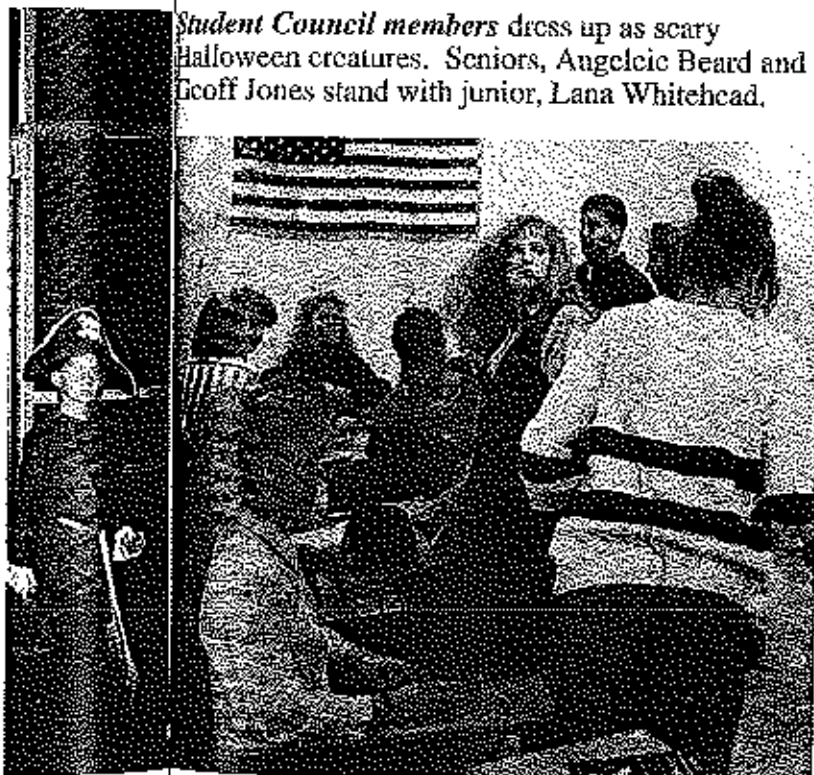

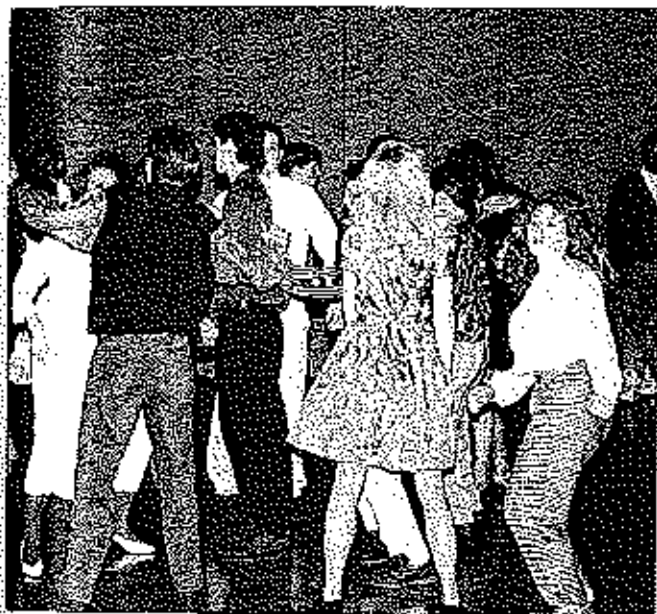

Leech gave a few words of advice after receiving salutatorian honors.

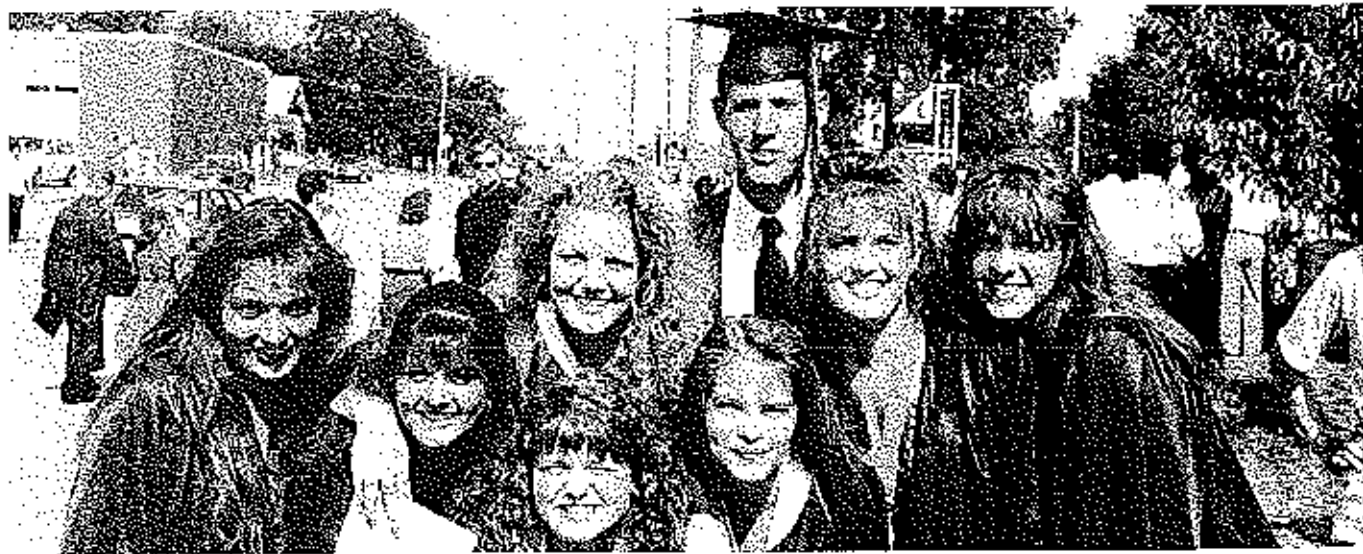
After being named valedictorian, Tiffany Hayes gave a tear jerking speech that touched everyone's heart. Her well applied address was credited by a standing ovation.

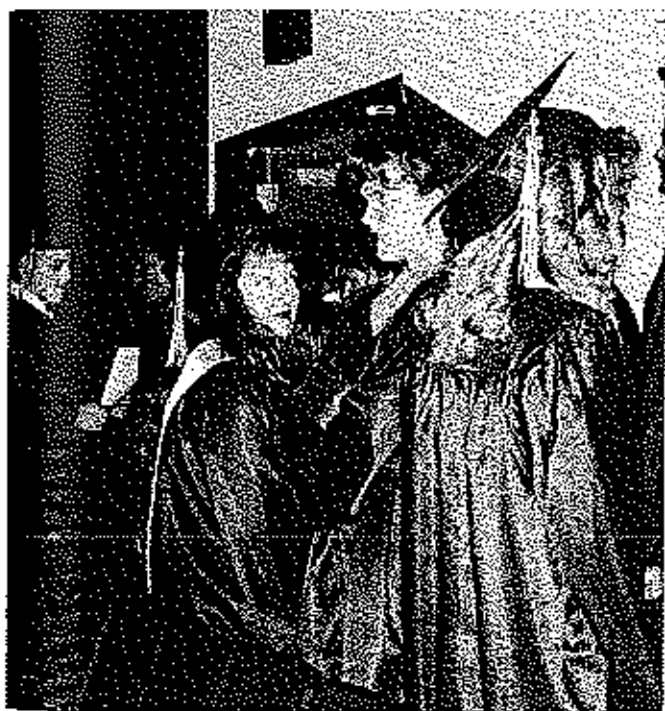
