This year, students seemed to gain new perspective on before school activities. People enjoyed playing hackey sack and also using the computer lab to cruise the Internet.







games I only have 1 or 2 nights a week to work," states a senior employee.











Telling the story of two sweet, not so innocent old ladies who take in boarders to supplement their income, mystery surfaces when bodies are discovered in the basement.


Eccentric characters add to the


After much laughter and suspense, the audience soon sees the resolution to the play's conflict.







#### Pearson Crowned Queen



In order to prepare for the season, cheerleaders attended summer camps and practices every Wednesday night. Their presence added a little extra perspective to each game.




