






#### Restless Spirit


#### DEĆA displays restless spirit


Besides the hard work of competition, students in DECA go on field trips to places like the Science Center in St. Louis and others.



preparation as a crucial skill for the work place Contests, conferences and job shadowing experiences are all part of the process for bringing the workplace to the student.









and Rona Schwintek.



All of the nominees then competed in the games that were held at the dance. At the end of the night all the points and votes were added up to decide who the king and queen would be.



As a tradition, the retiring queen, Cassic Pearson, crowned the new queen, while the retiring king, Chuck Greeson, gave the new king his pocket knife,








Another aspect of club membership was participating in drama and debate tournaments and staging presentations for the students at Middle School and South elementary.



Those attending had pictures, ate a good meal and danced to a great deejay. Afterwards, many attended Project Prom where nice prizes were awarded.



After four long years of working and studying and making memories at EHS, the Class of '97 graduated on a Sunday afternoon in May.



Not all grads went on the Float, but nearly all did something to mark this rite of passage.






Restless spirits are everywhere but now there seems to be a sadness mixed in, for the old cliche is true ... we will never walk this way again.




