



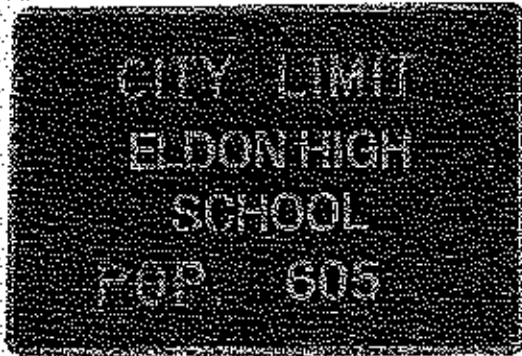

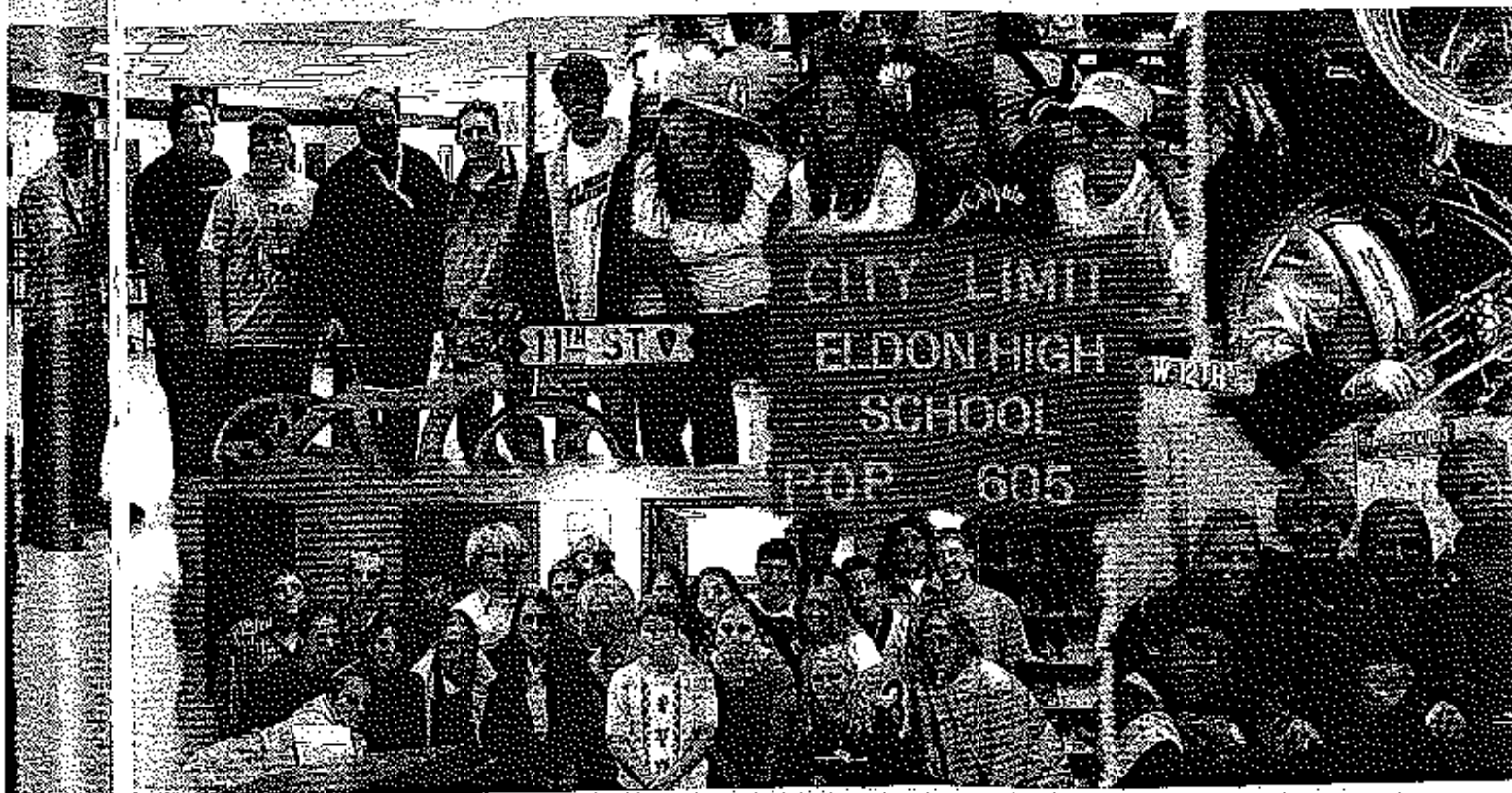
# JOURNEY

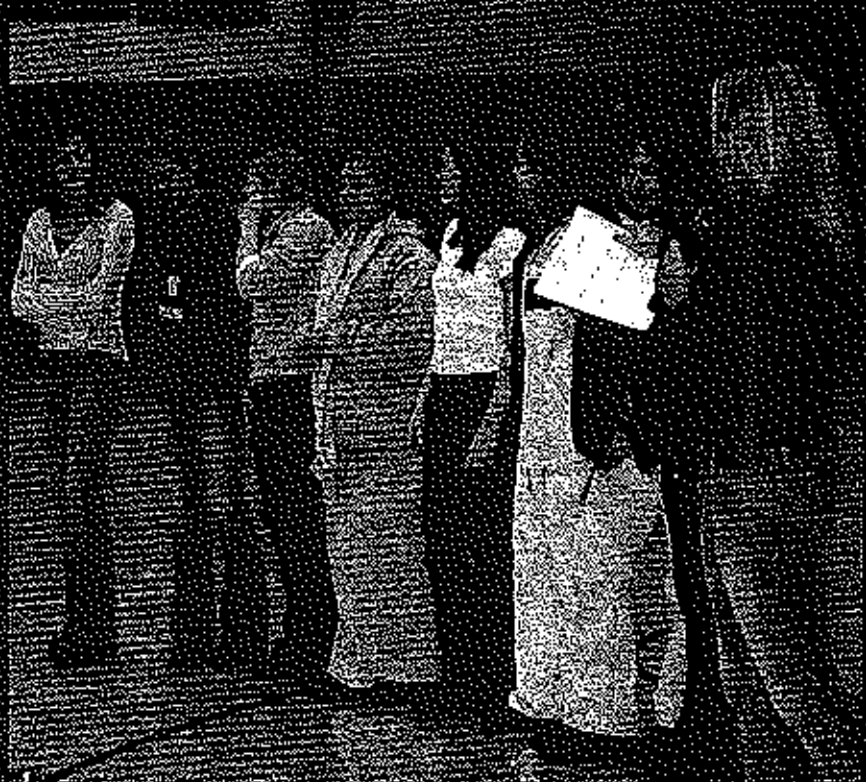

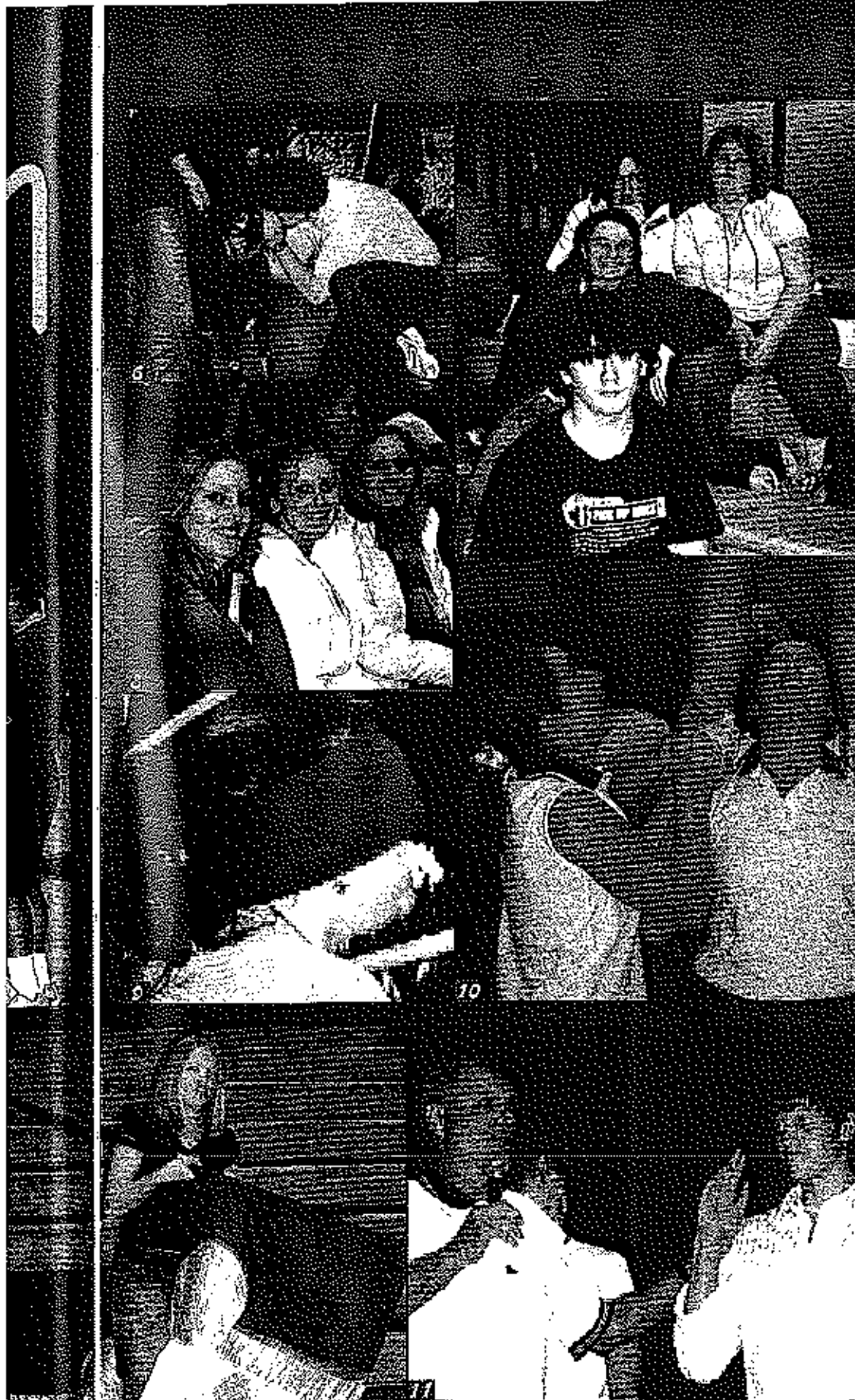

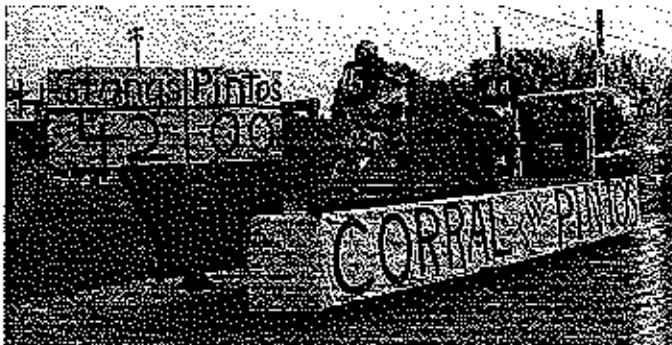

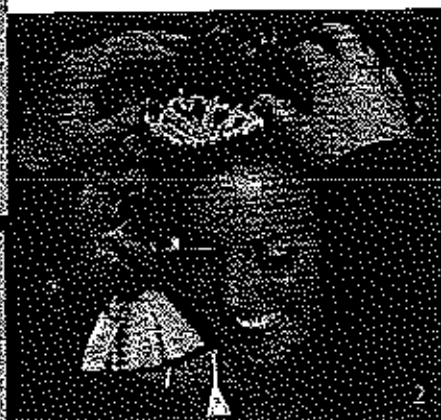

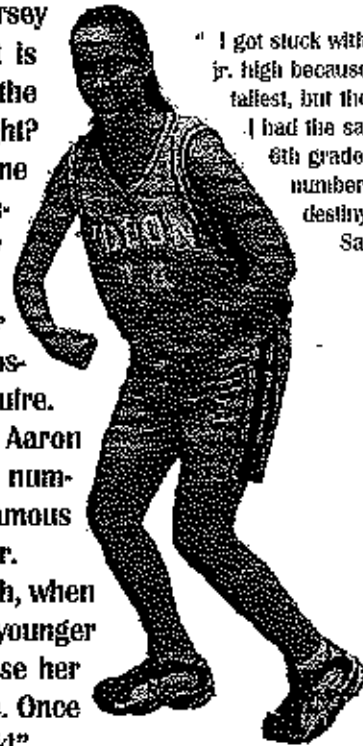
# Can I Have Your Number?

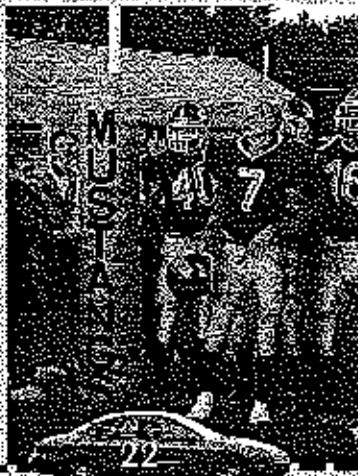
For a more wacky approach, when junior Colleen McDevitt was younger and playing soccer, she chose her numbers according to her age. Once she got to #10, "It just stuck!"

Numbers may be meaningless to those who don't have to choose them, but to those who do, these numbers are part of the journey.



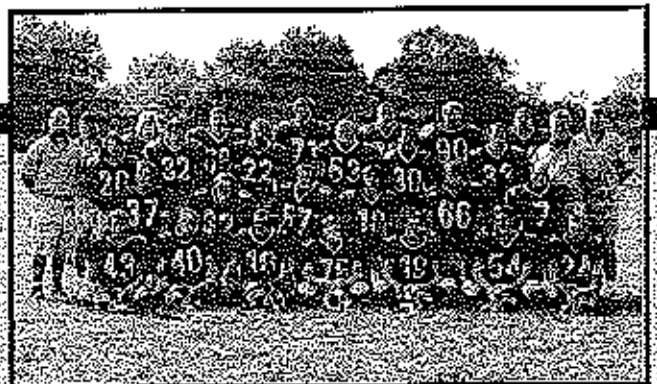

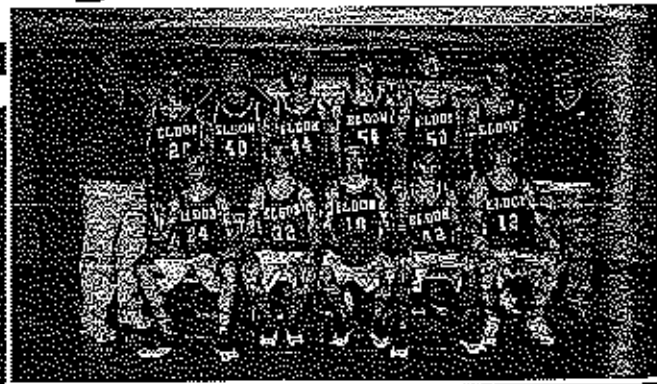


# Pit Stops

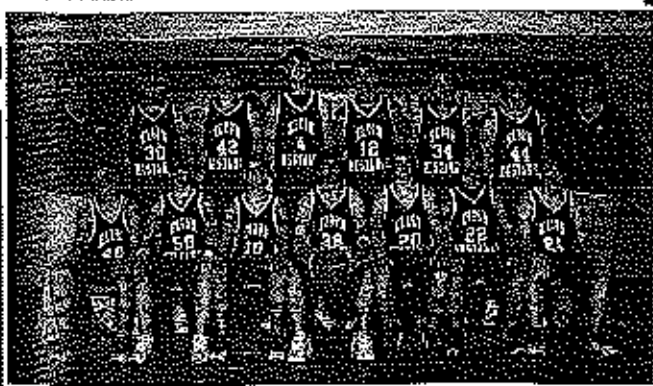

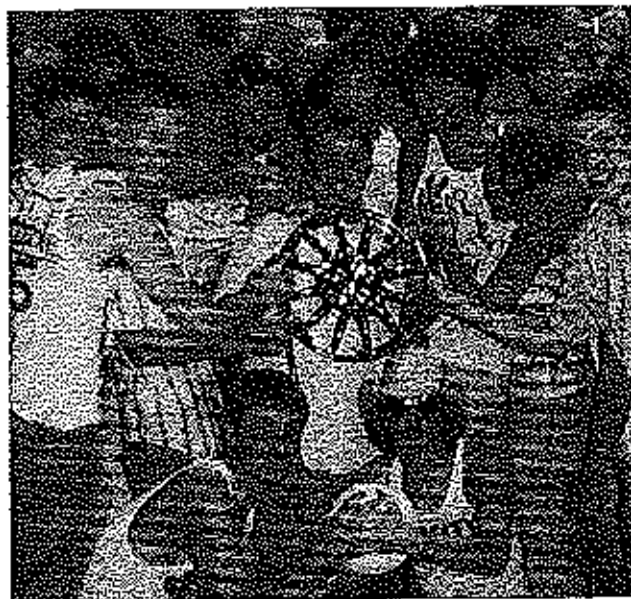

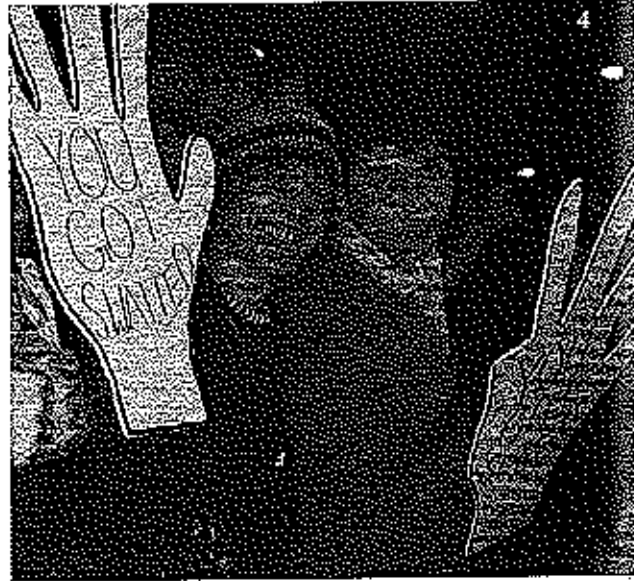

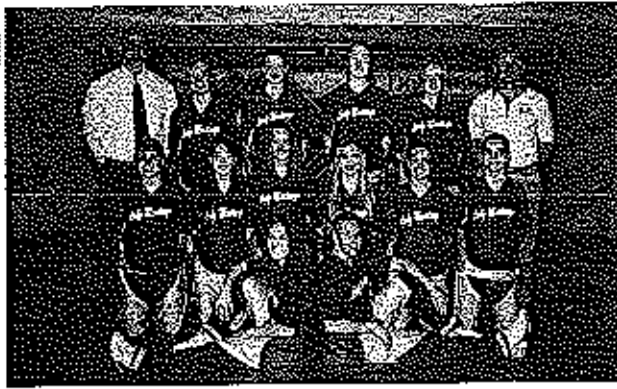

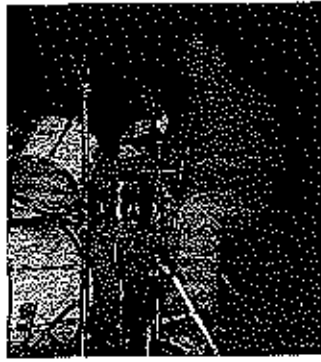

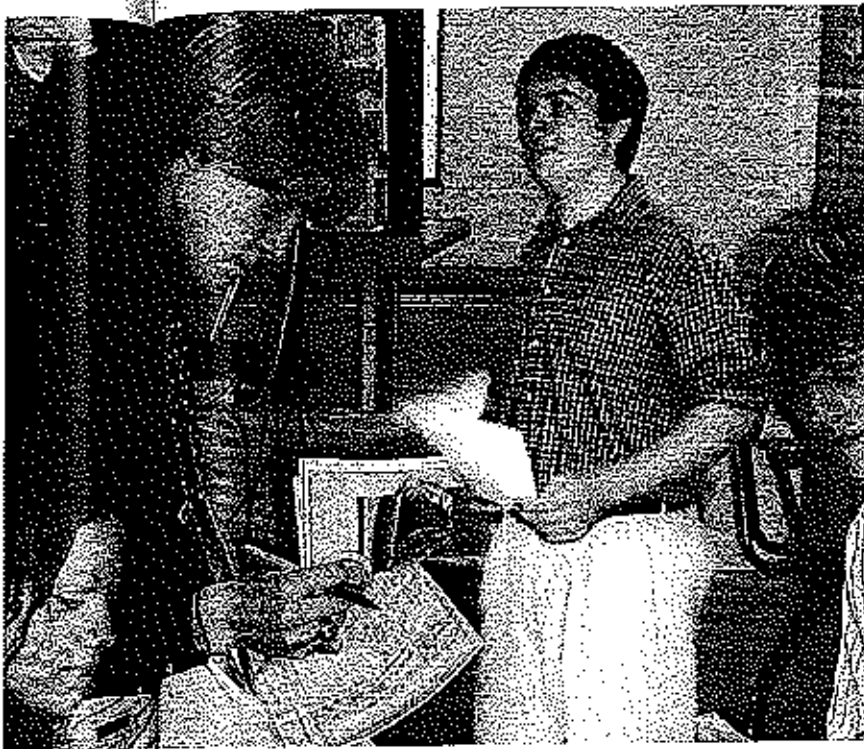

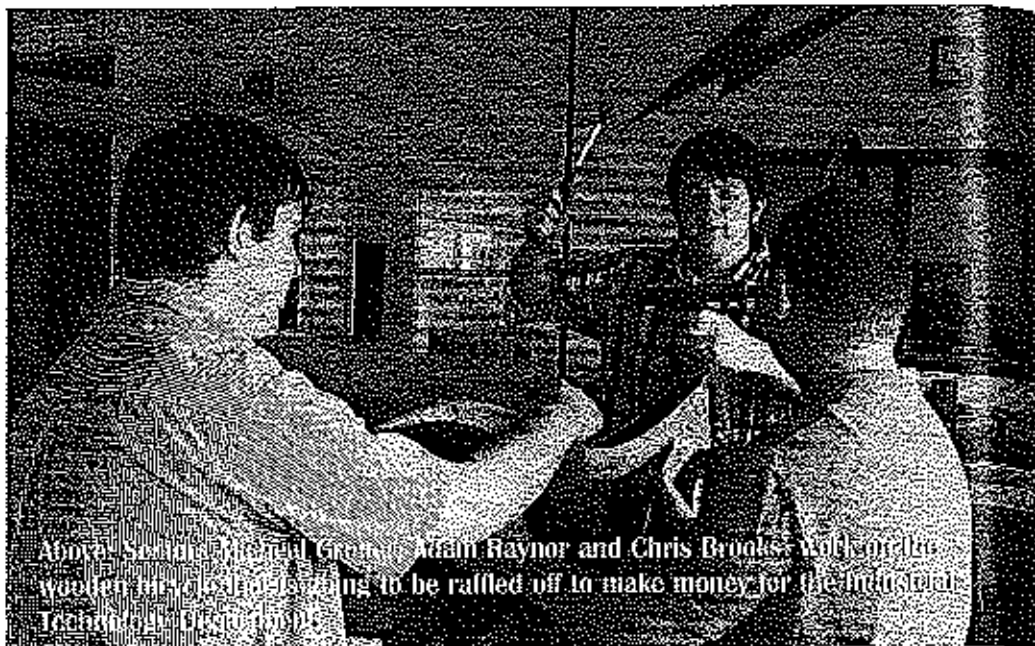

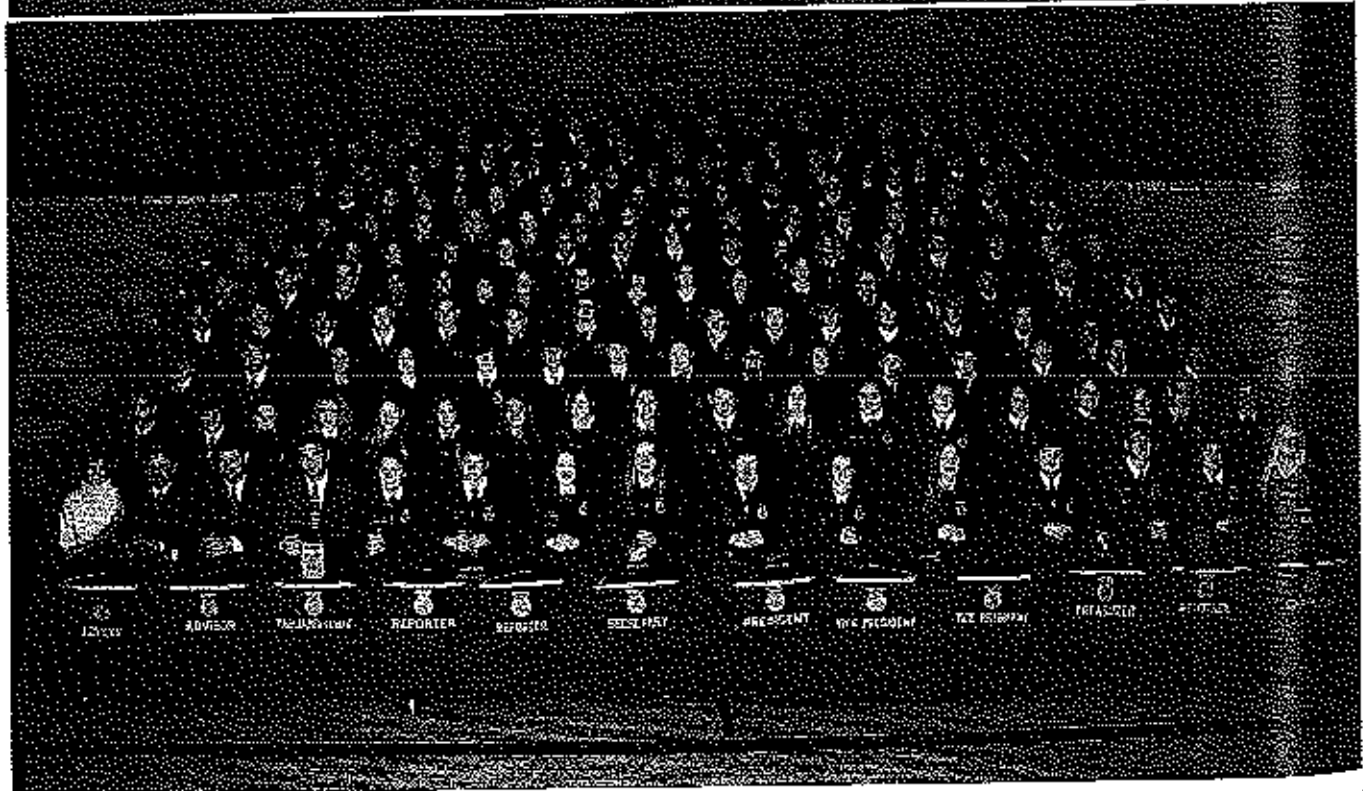
# Exceeding the Speed Limit

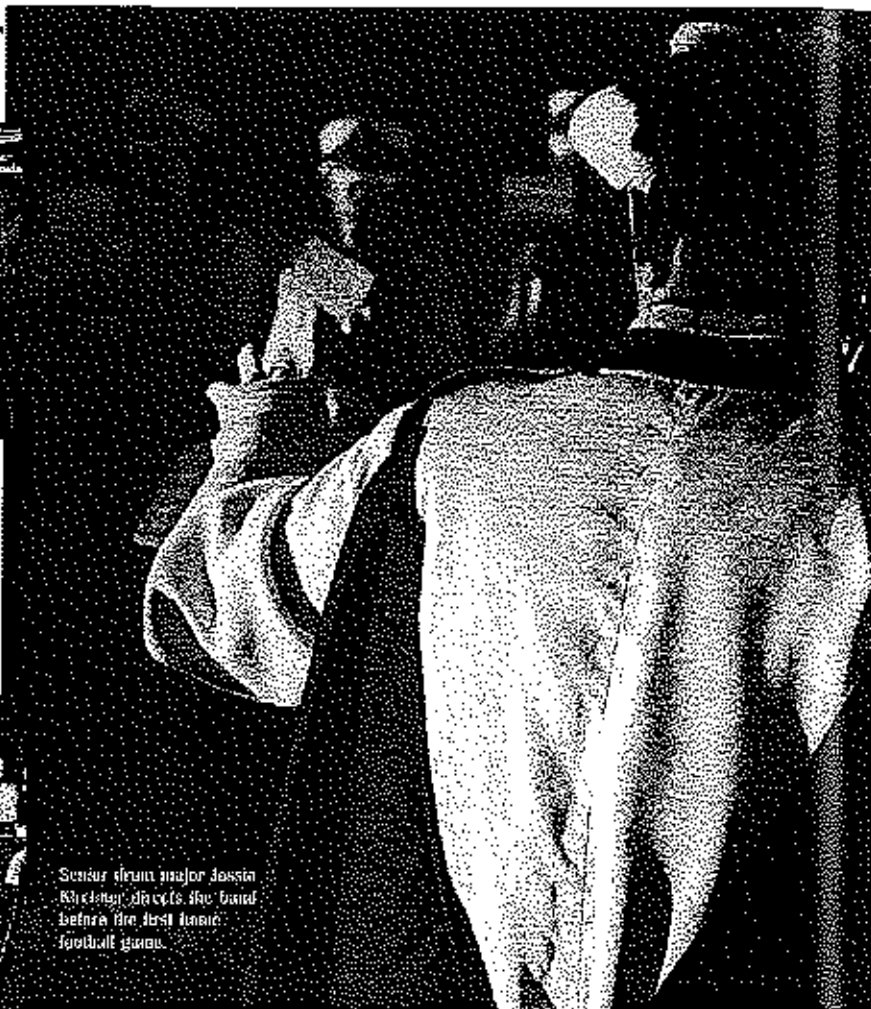
