
But no matter where this journey takes us, at least we know that we have taken it together, and now we can look back to see how far we have driven. That is what makes it special. That is what makes it Our Journey.
















For a more wacky approach, when junior Colleen McDevitt was younger and playing soccer, she chose her numbers according to her age. Once she got to #10, "it just stuck!"

Numbers may be meaningless to those who don't have to choose them, but to those who do, these numbers are part of the journey.




















