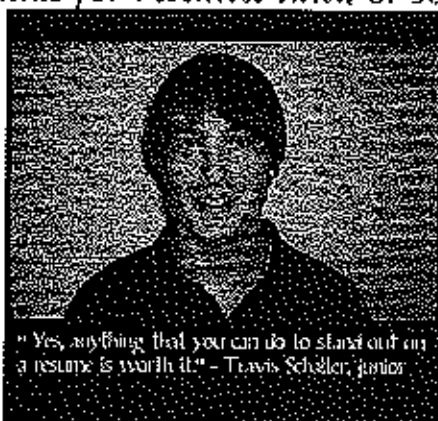

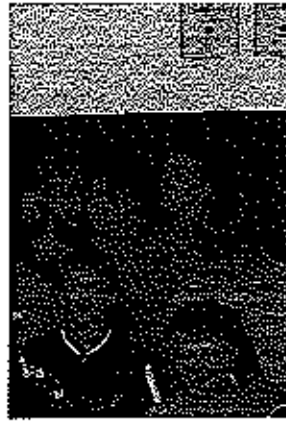

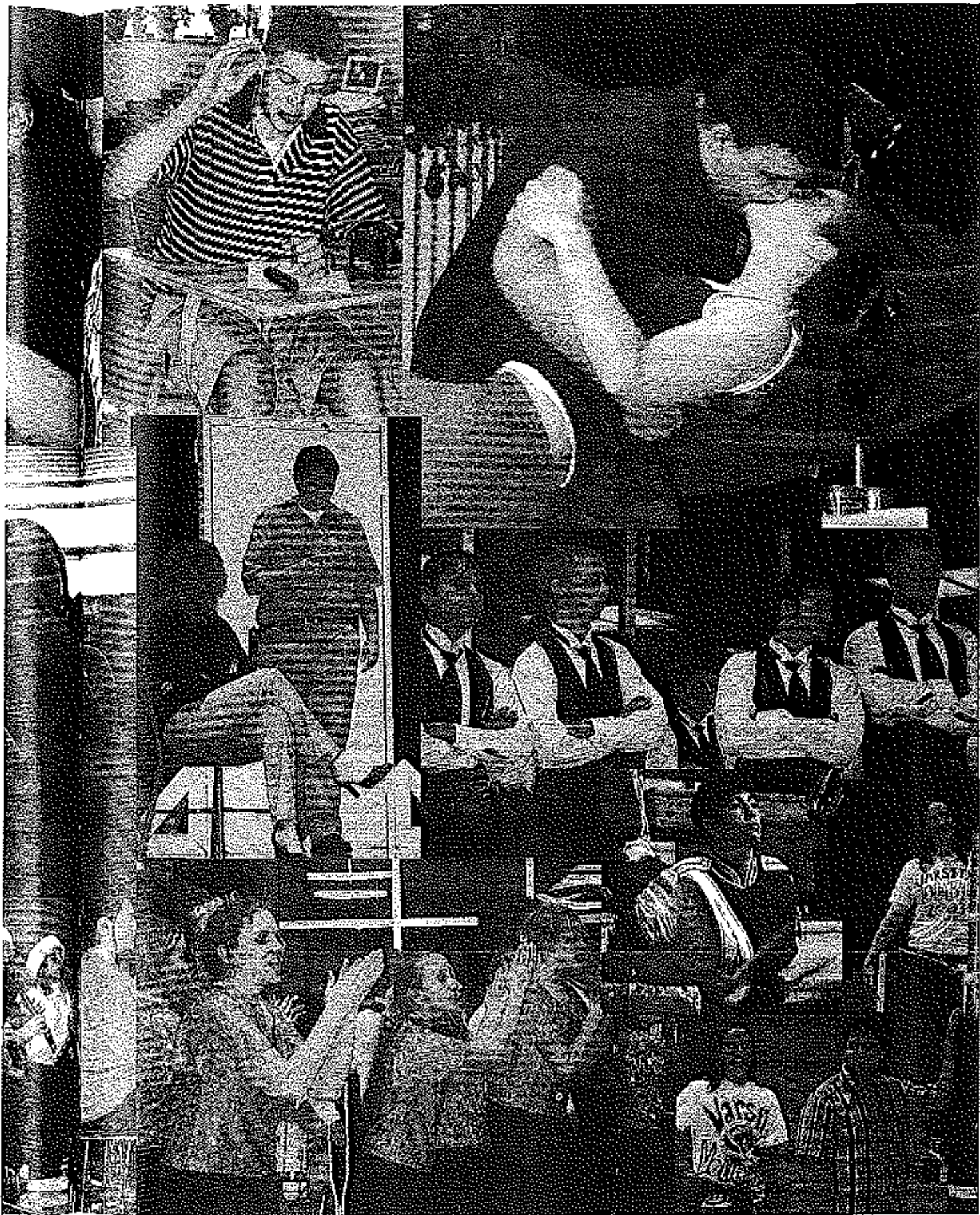

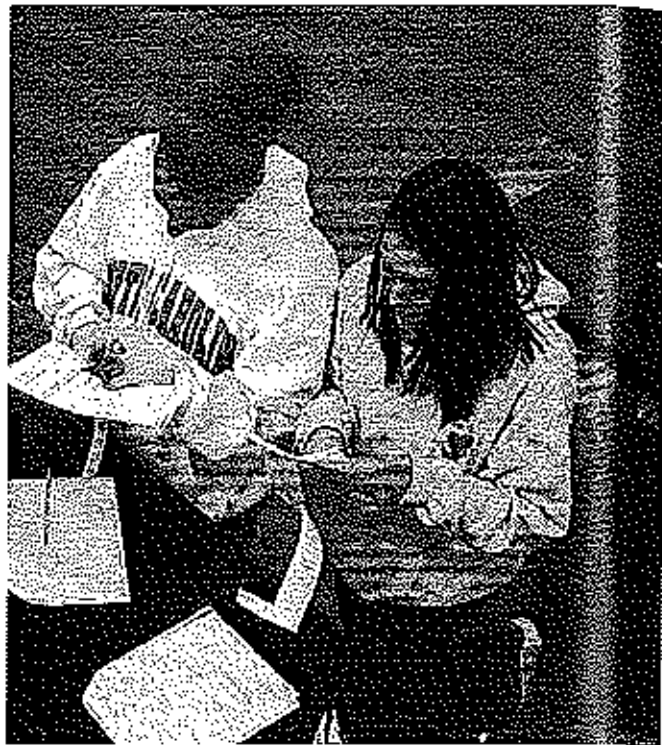




Below: Sophomores Meredith Schofield and Courtney Wardenburg study for a test in Mrs. Blsge's 7th hour C.P. Biology.

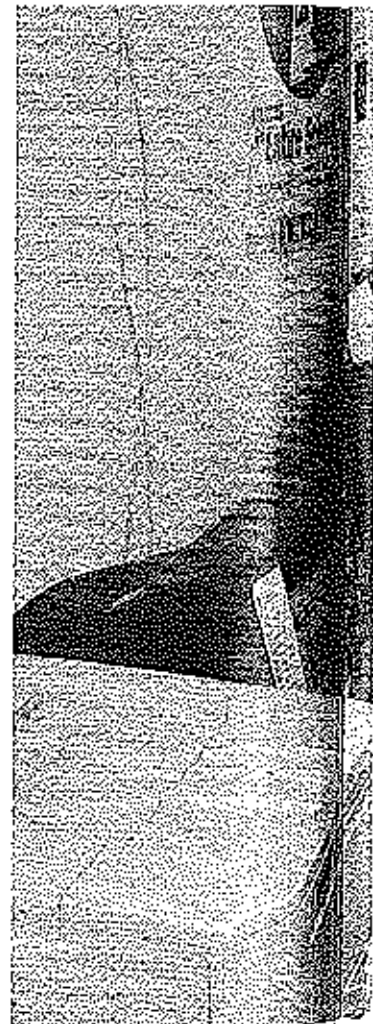


Right: Sophomores Nikki Griffey and Lacey Green work hard on cutting out shapes for a biology project.

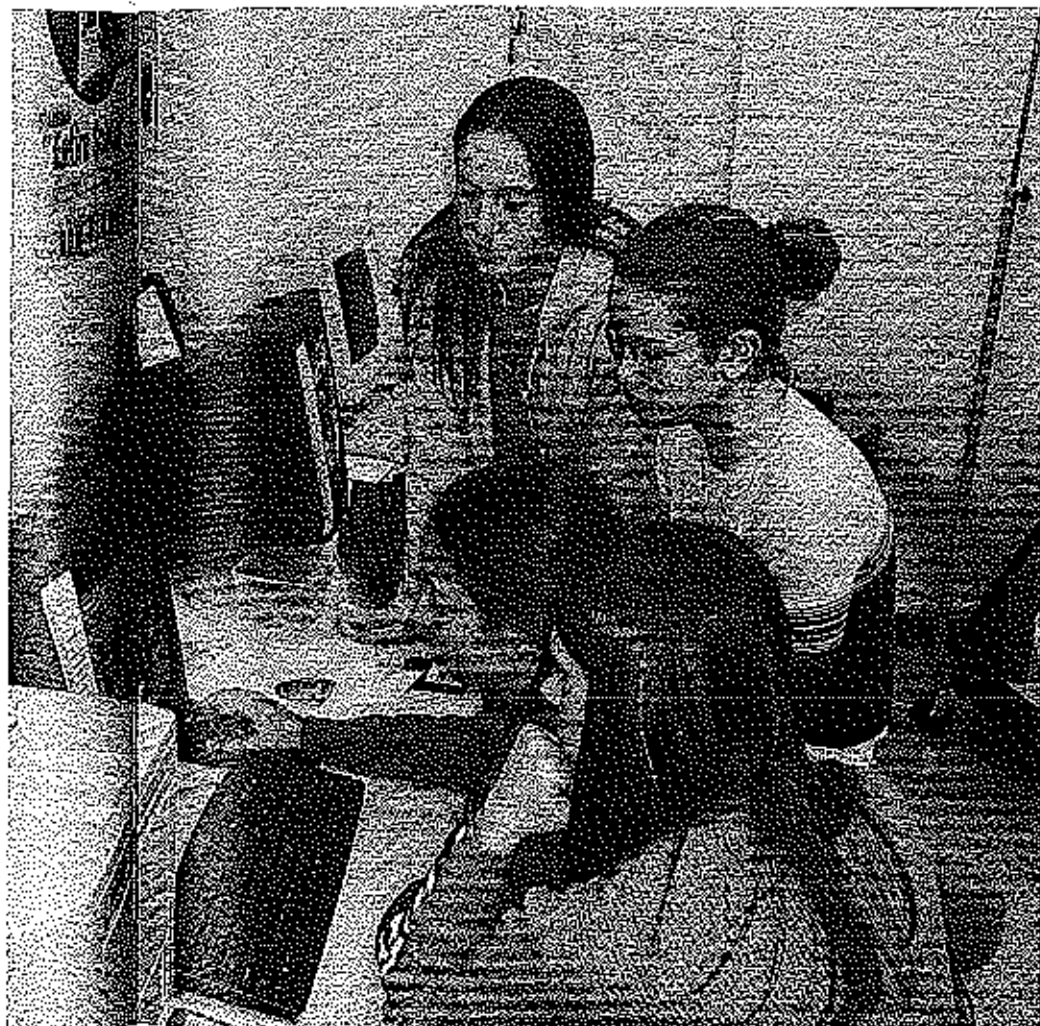

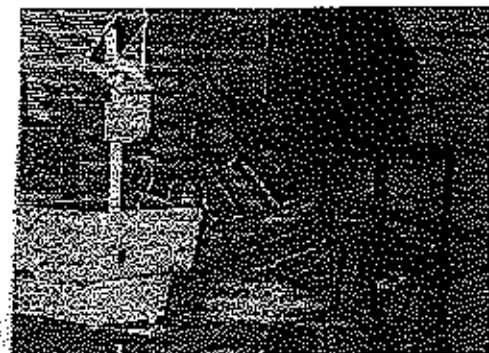

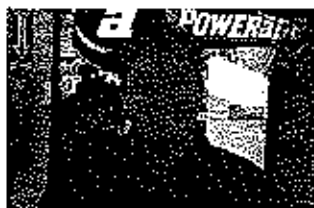

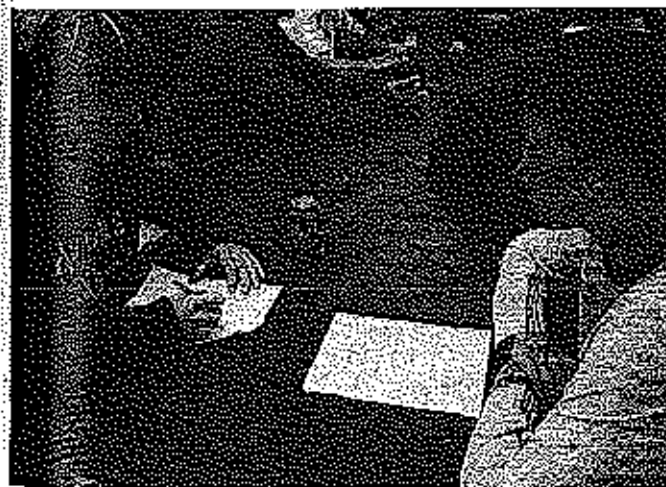

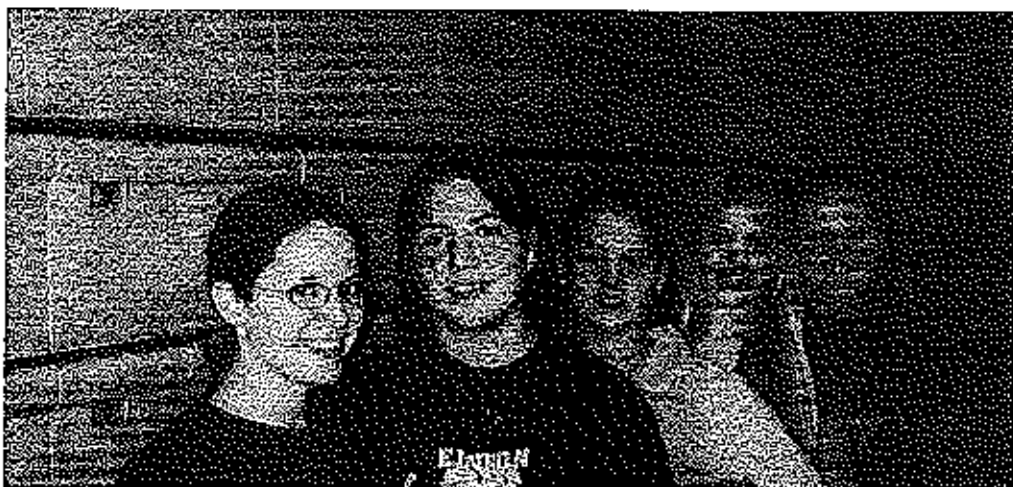

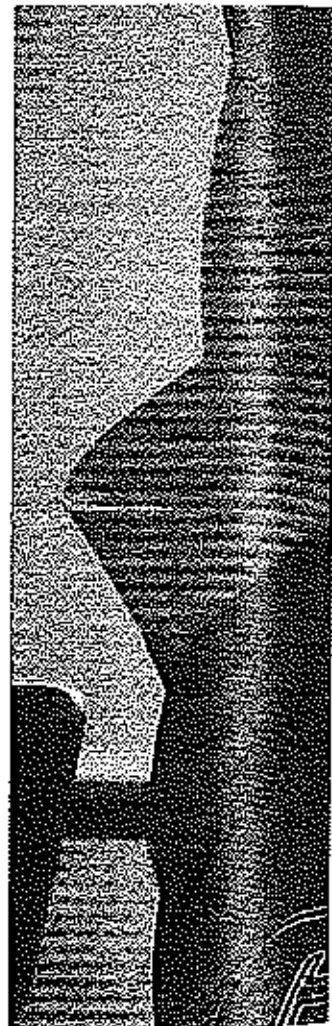

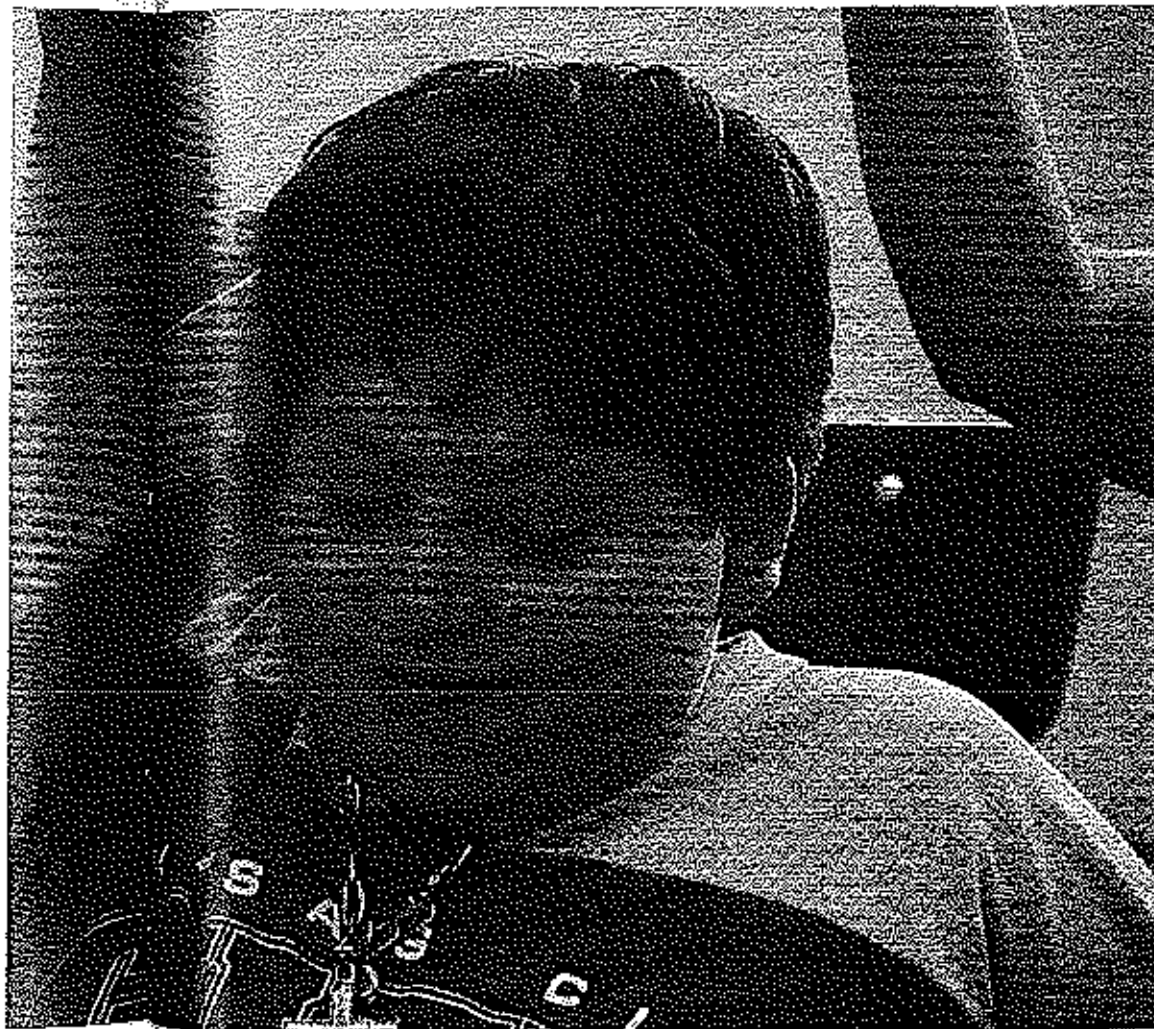

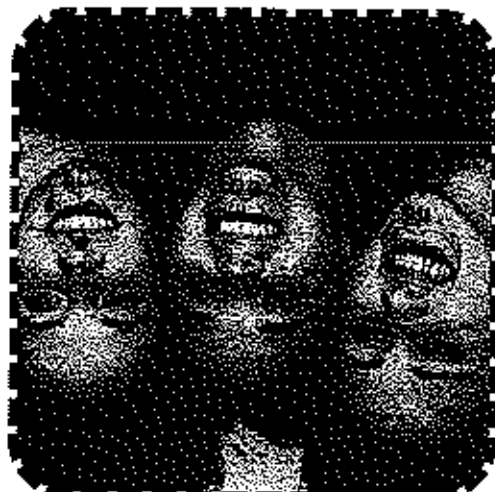

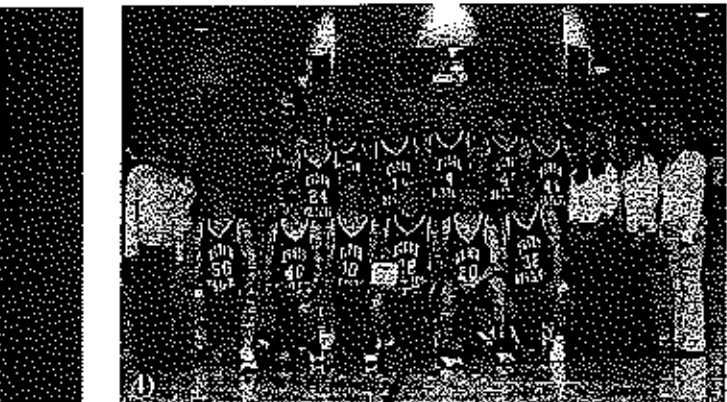
