




## Students Create Opinions About the Tax Levy



## Eldon Taxpayers Vote No

On April 5, 2005, the Eldon R-1 School District proposed a \$3.39 levy increase to offset reduced state funding. The district saw this as a necessary measure because it has deficit spent for the last three years. An "I Care" Committee was formed to gain support. It wasn't long before a counter-committee came about to convince taxpayers to vote no. What started out as two groups of people sharing their opinions, quickly turned into a political war. The opposing group inflated administration pay and numbers of administrators to influence voters. The campaign was filled with controversy, and about 3,000 voters cast ballots on April 5. The levy failed by 139 votes. However, it wasn't over for many. Disappointed community members voiced their opinions in *The Eldon Advertiser*, the next week, and the district made plans to present the issue again on the August ballot.



### Setting the Facts and Spreading the Word

After the informative meeting, Alex Tia Stanwix asks Dr. Hall a few tough questions about the levy. The student panelist let it slip that the ears of students will encourage everyone to vote yes, placing "I Care" signs in their windows.










