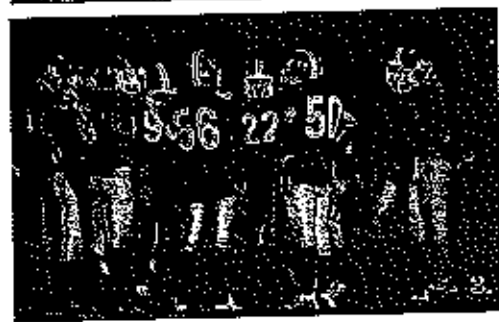

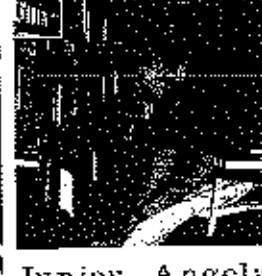

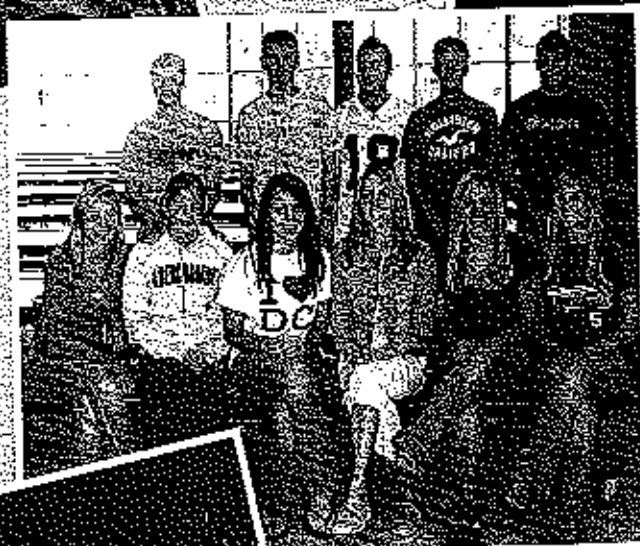

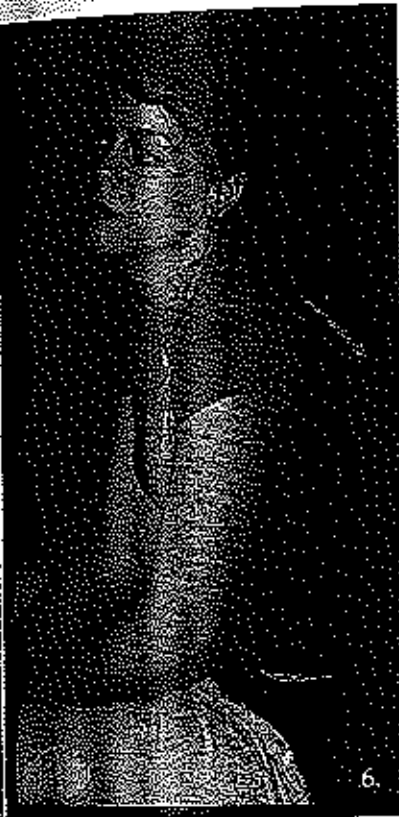

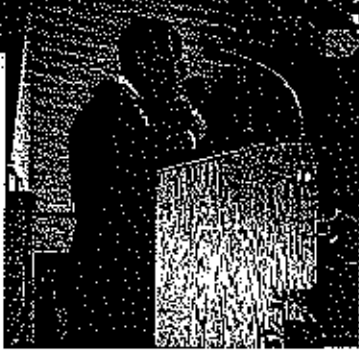

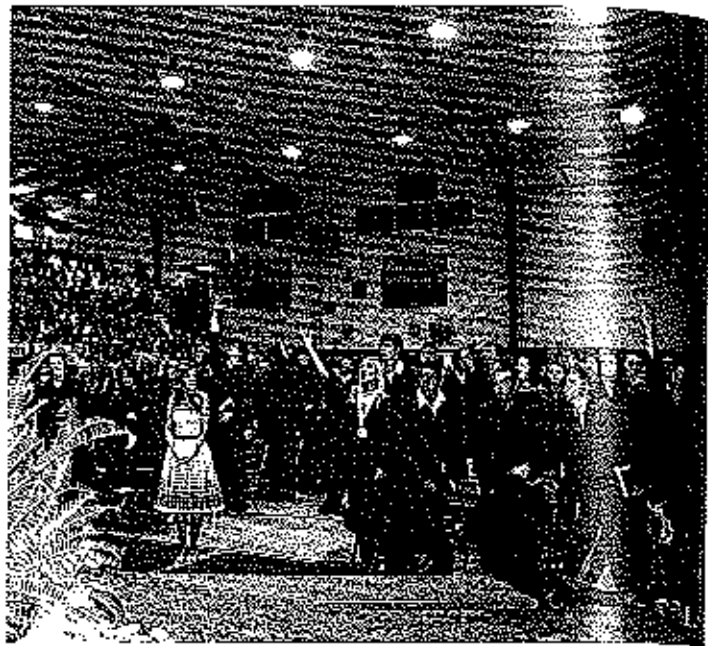

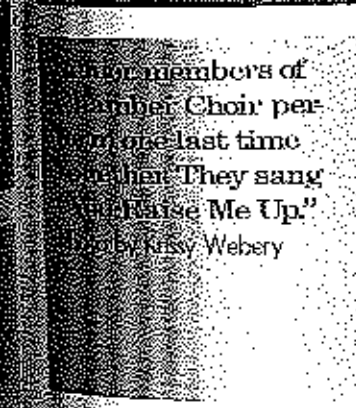

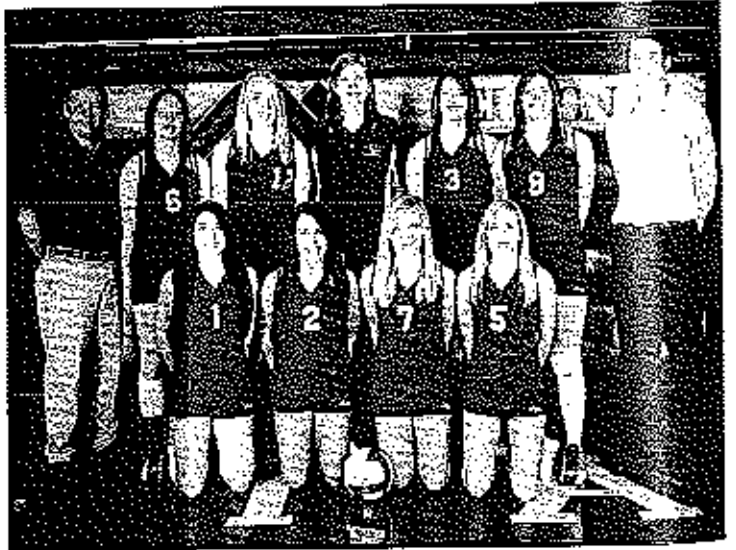

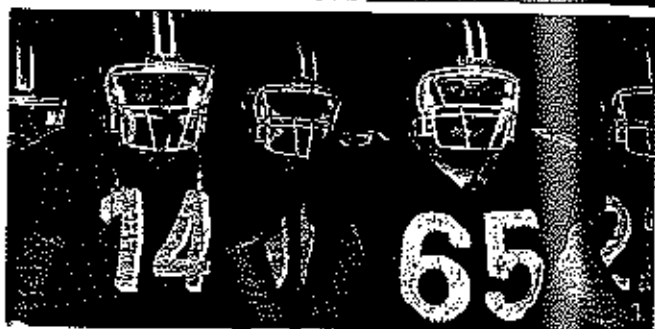

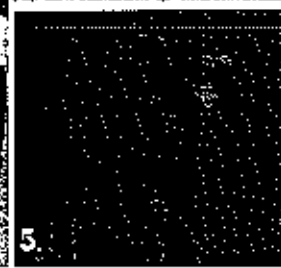

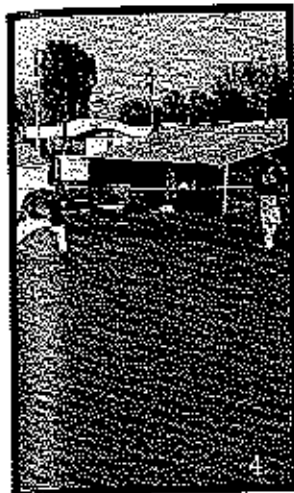

"99% of the students here have been told by someone that they can't succeed," said Paul Blanchard. Mr. Blanchard is a teacher at the Mustang Academy, also known as the alternative school. This school works to overcome those difficulties that have kept students from being successful. Staff members work in small groups and one-on-one with those who have either dropped out of school or had difficulties in the regular school system. Working at the Mustang Academy with Mr. Blanchard are teacher Susan Kriegshauser; para-professional Dorothy Walker, and Ameri-Academy provides services fallen far behind his cohort that student can enter the recovery with the goal of regular high school "caught on track to graduate. The fifth-year seniors or second-who are far behind on credits ing with their class. The students will study to pass the GED exam and, upon passing, can receive a high school diploma, not just a GED certificate. Students in the Option program get 15 hours a week of direct instruction and must be employed for 15-20 hours a week. They also must have passed their Missouri and U.S. Constitution tests. Students who have been suspended long-term can also attend the Academy and receive their schoolwork. Normally, a student on OSS cannot make up work missed, but if they attend the Academy, the high school will provide the assignments. "Being part of this program is not a right; it's a privilege for students who want to obtain their high school diploma," said Mr. Blanchard. He adds, "Most successful students are the ones who have goals." The staff tries to prepare students in every way possible, hoping every student who walks in the door walks out having achieved success.

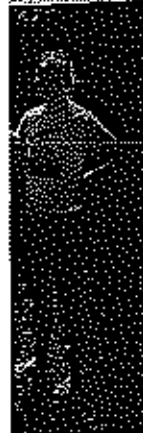

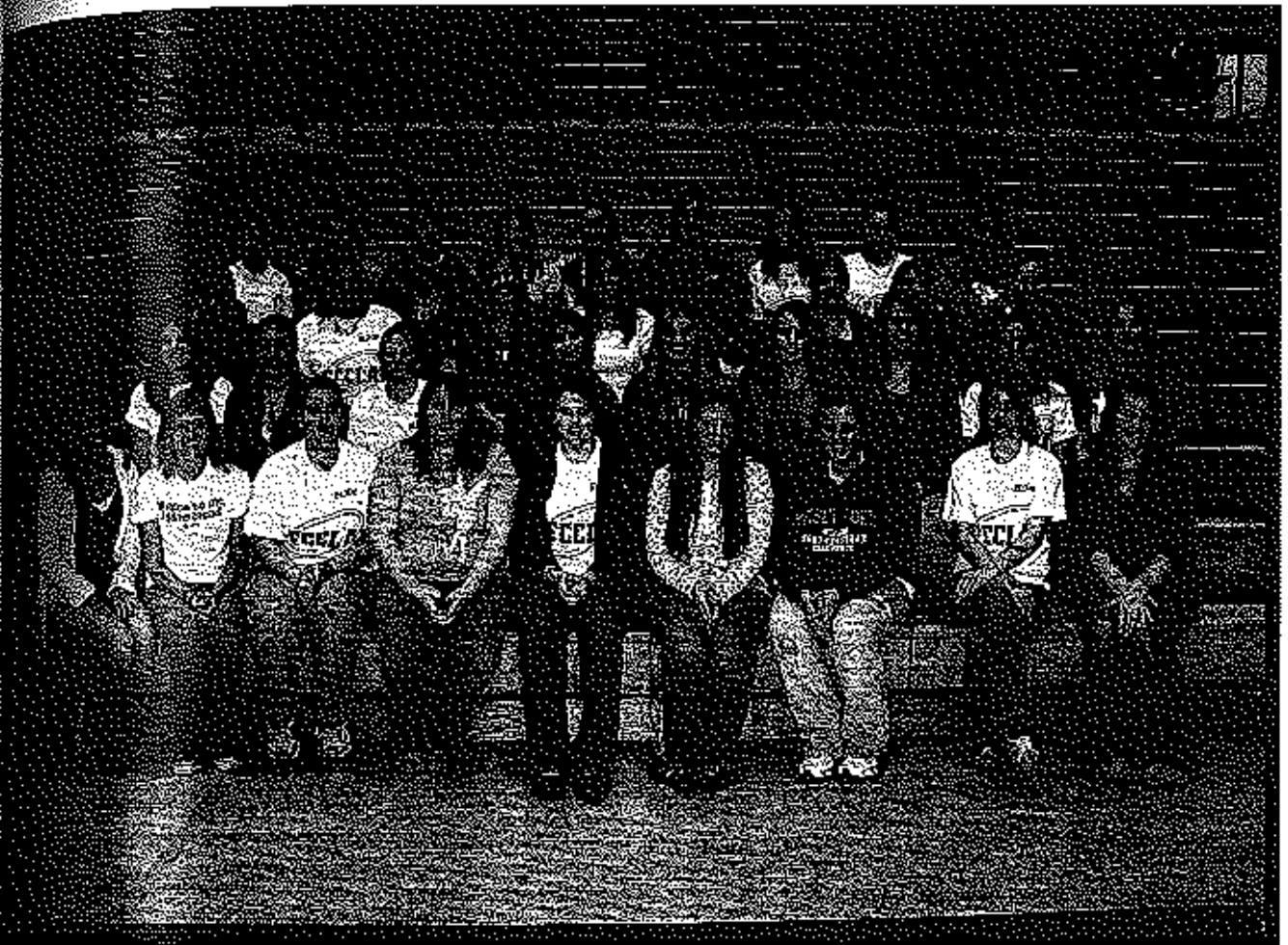

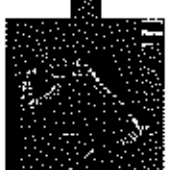

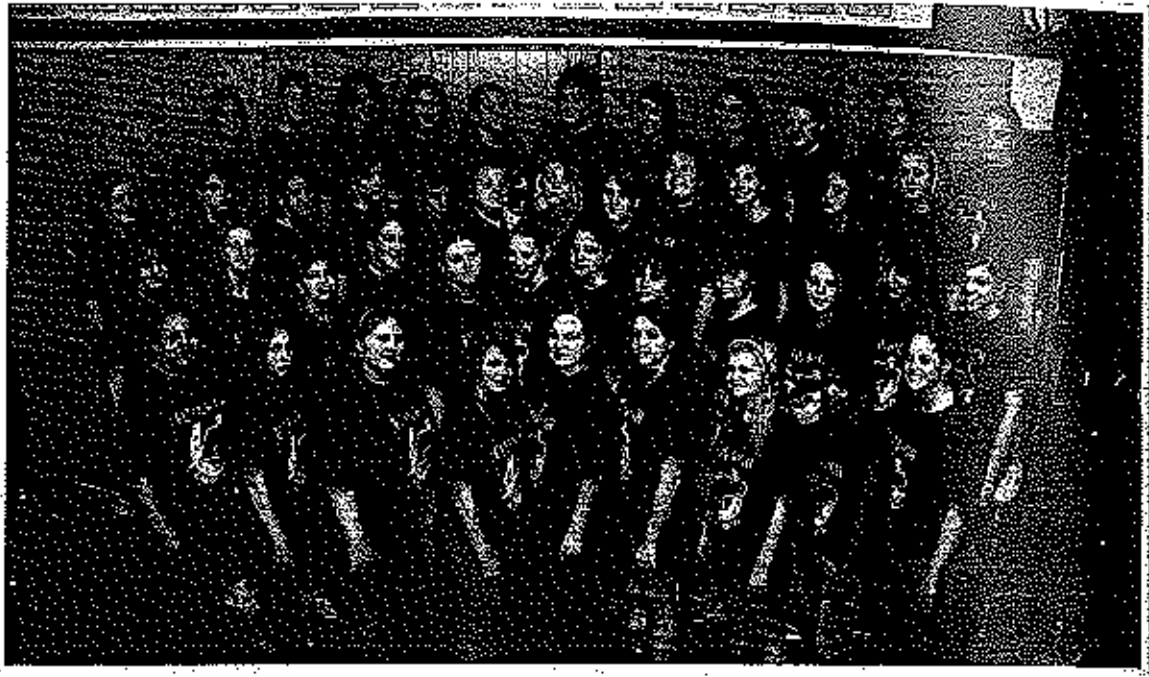

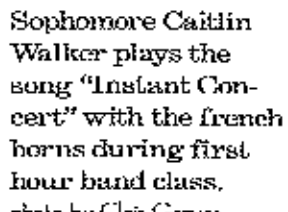

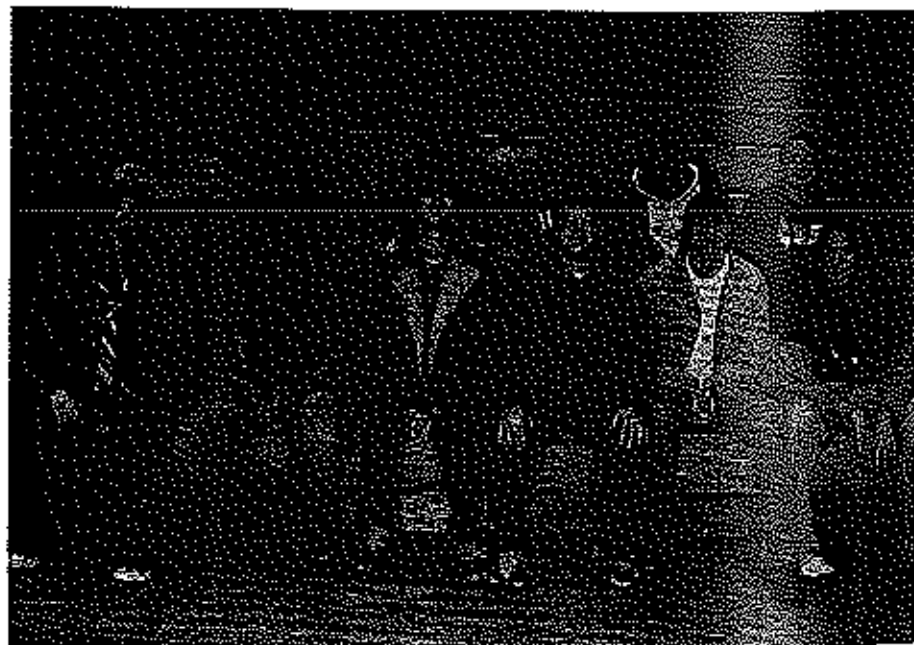

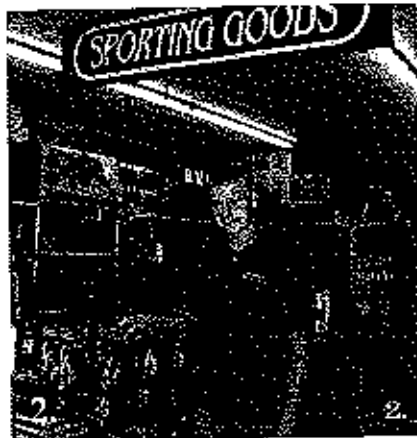
