

Eldon R-1 Special Services

Special Education

Special education and related services are provided to all students aged 3-21 who meet IDEA criteria. All services are related to the student's individual education program. The goal of special education in the Eldon R-1 school district is to help all identified students be independent and employable.

Section 504

A 504 plan is designed to assist a student that has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activity. A 504 plan details placement, services, modifications or accommodations needed to access the curriculum.

Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE)

The ECSE program is designed for students who meet IDEA eligibility criteria and are 3 to 5 years old but not kindergarten age. Special education and related services are delivered to the student based on IEP services and goals. ECSE classes have non-disabled peers as well that act as peer models.

Parents as Teachers

Parents are the first and most important teacher of any student. P.A.T offers parents information, screenings, developmental information and much more to parents. Services are offered from pre-natal through kindergarten age. Monthly and bi-monthly family meetings are available as well as group play sessions.

Homebound Instruction

Homebound instruction is offered to students who are deemed by a medical professional unable to attend school regularly. In these cases, (whether it be short term or long term) a certified teacher meets with the student either in the home or a neutral setting so that the student can continue to progress in their education.
